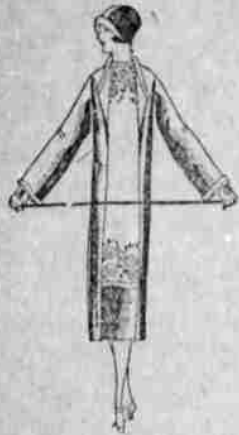

and dish washing sinks, and other equipment for preparation of the food. The kitchen will be separated from the serving room by cupboards opening on each, where dishes will be kept for use in the cafeteria.

In the serving room will be found the usual cafeteria equipment, the coffee urn, steam table, coolers, slide rails, etc.

Doors will open into the serving room from the corridor, so that the students may pass to procure their trays and utensils, and then pass along in front of the serving tables, and through another entrance directly into the cafeteria, which is separated from the serving room only by sliding windows. This combination cafeteria and sewing room, will seat 85 persons at once, giving ample room for small banquets.

One-third of the tables can be used by the sewing classes at all times except while the cafeteria is in use. The sewing department will be equipped with sewing machines, and a fitting room.

The auditorium is in the center of the building and has an over-all size of 85 by 75 feet, including on the south side a stage 15 feet in depth by 62 feet in width. At the back of this room will be placed a row of bleacher seats set on concrete, accommodating 600 persons. Entrance ways to the gymnasium will be five in number—two each from the corridor and one, a central entrance on the north side of the building. Entrance to the stage is also gained from the main corridor at the front of the building. Both the stage and combined auditorium and gymnasium will be two stories in height. The main floor of this room will be 85 by 45 feet in size, giving ample room for a full sized basketball court. Folding chairs will be on hand and can be placed on the gymnasium floor for the more important assemblies and evening entertainments, giving the auditorium a total seating capacity of over 1,000.

Underneath the tiers of seats

at the back will be placed the boys and girls locker rooms, each opening on a corridor and central entrance. Ample locker space is provided all boys and girls who are to participate in any sport.

Admission to the second floor is gained by two stairways, off the ends of the stage.

Only sufficient basement is to be provided to house the heating equipment, care for the storing of fuel and the janitor's rooms.

To cut down expense the industrial art and farm shop will not be set up as a part of the building. A frame structure for this purpose will be erected to the northwest of the main building and will be used until funds are available in the future for the proper construction of a building for this purpose.

The second floor consists mainly of recitation rooms, which are six in number, in addition to the commercial department, which will occupy the northwest corner, consisting of typewriting, shorthand and bookkeeping rooms, to care for 30 students each, the rooms being conveniently connected.

Over the main entrance, on the second floor, will be placed the study hall, which will be 36 feet in length, and will seat 156 students, and provide for a small platform at the front where a piano can be placed. This room can be used for the smaller assemblies of students.

At the rear of the study hall and opening into it, is to be placed the library, which will house two or three thousand volumes of books and seat 48 students. Boys' and girls' lavatories are also provided on this floor.

The grounds are to be greatly beautified and a landscape gardener, A. L. Peck, of the extension department of the Oregon Agricultural College, is to be here on March 27, to look over the site and make recommendations of proposed improvements.
