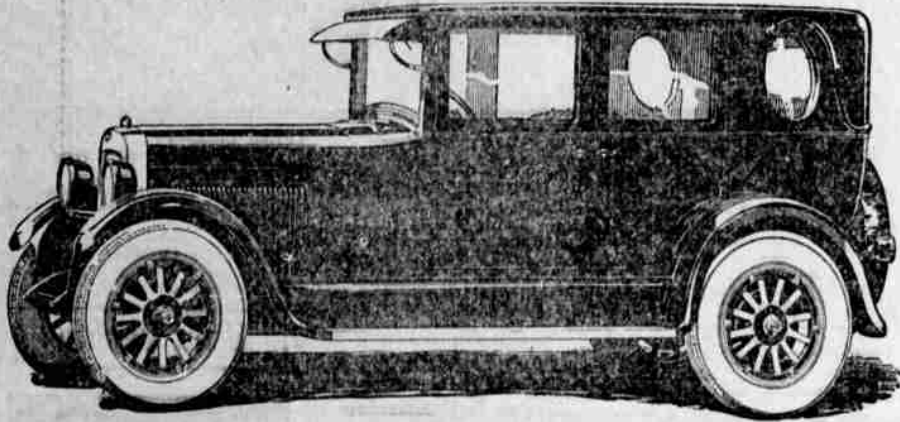

SMUGGLING SYSTEM CHARGED IN TRIAL

OTTAWA, March 26.—Existence of a great system of "boot-legging" in humanity, whereby Armenian immigrants were smuggled or brought into the United States and Canada on passports illegally obtained, has been charged by George B. Stough, an Armenian on trial here for conspiring to obtain a passport under false pretense.

NEW RADIUM RAYS THOUGHT FOUND

(Associated Press Licensed Wire.) LONDON, March 26.—Experts of Middlesex hospital in London, the center of British radium research, claim to have made an important discovery enabling the curative value of any given quantity of radium to be multiplied thousands of times.

Briefly, the discovery consists in bottling radium fans, known as radon, in tiny glass tubes. Radium emits three kinds of rays, known as Alpha, Beta and Gamma, but hitherto only the Gamma rays have been harnessed. The present success concerns the beta rays, which the experts now are capturing, purifying, condensing and confining in glass tubes a little thicker than a human hair, to which is given the name "zeds."

These "zeds" are prepared to distribute to other hospitals for curative purposes, and suggest they may prove useful in treating cancer, although they deprecate the idea that they are likely to prove revolutionary or offer a certain cure.

The Beta rays, which have a profound effect upon the tissues of the body hitherto have run to waste, but now, bottled, they can be used in conjunction with the Gamma rays, and it is from this use that greater results are expected. The Alpha rays are very weak and are regarded as negligible.

FAST PASSENGER AND AIRPLANE RACE

He obtained a commercial airplane and followed the route the train had taken. He landed at Lake Charles, La., when he mistook a train for the one trailed. Again taking the airplane, he was nearing New Orleans when the ship was forced down.

BIG STADIUM MUST HAVE FIRE WALLS

(Associated Press Licensed Wire.) NEW YORK, March 26.—Cold water is poured upon the New York district's hope for a heavy weight championship boxing bout this summer by fire officials yesterday. Fire walls must be included in the plans for the Henderson crater, scheduled to seat 110,000, which is about to rise in Long Island City. This entails an additional cost of more than \$100,000 and there were reports that the project had been abandoned. Charles S. Henderson, the sponsor of the new stadium said, however, that he will continue construction. Henderson was elected with Jack Kearns, manager of Jack Dempsey, for a short time, but if the prospect of a bout this summer was discussed, no information was forthcoming.

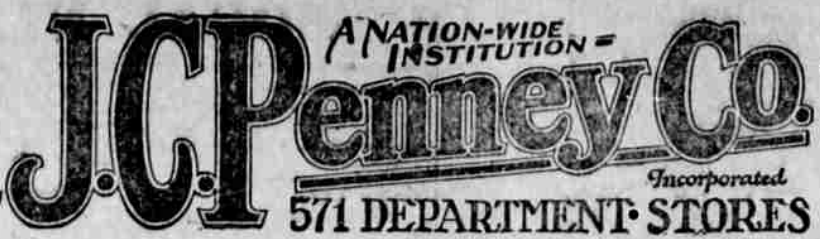

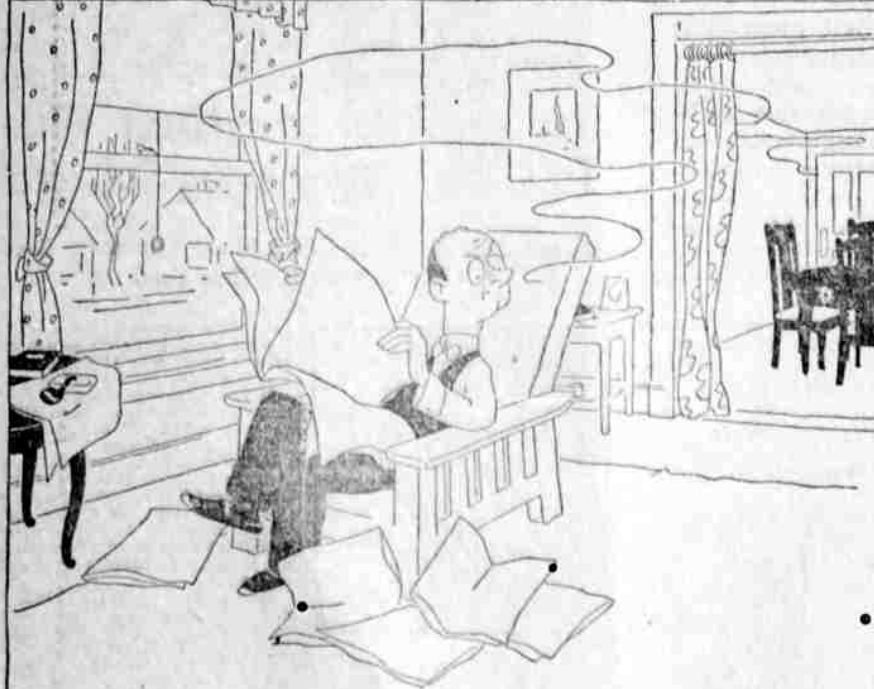
