M. of April 1, 1925, receive at his office in the City of Roseburg, Douglas County, Oregon, sealed bids for the purchase of negotiable serial coupon bonds of School District No. 4 in Douglas County, Oregon, in the sum of \$165,000.00.

Said bonds will be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, dated May 1, 1925, and maturing as follows: 6 bonds to mature May 1, 1926; 6 bonds to mature annually on May 1st of each and every year thereafter including May 1st, 1935; 11 bonds to mature annually on May 1st of each and every year thereafter including May 1st, 1940; 10 bonds to mature annually on May 1st of each and every year thereafter including May 1, 1944. ### FRENCH BIRTH RATE SHOWS BIG DECREASE

(Associated Press Licensed Wire.)  
PARIS, Mar. 26.—The French birth rate continues to decline, according to the vital statistics for last year, just completed.  
The births numbered 752,101 and the deaths 679,885, the excess of births over deaths being 72,216 as compared with 93,906 for the preceding year. Mr. Varior, authority on vital statistics, remarks that but for the population of the recovered province of Alsace-Lorraine, where large families are still usual, the situation would be much worse.  
According to figures gathered by him, the number of births steadily increased in France from the beginning of the nineteenth century and reached their peak during the second empire, with over 1,000,000 annually. After the war of 1870 they began to drop. Thus in 1874 there were 967,000 births in 1886, 907,000 in 1890, 867,000 in 1900, and 774,000.  
The doctor observes that the birth rate in Germany has begun to fall but that the excess of births over deaths still amounts to 399,000.

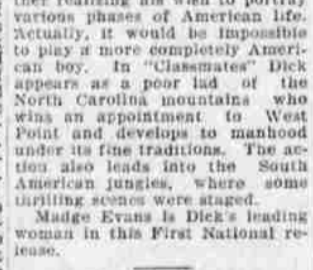

### DANCING GIRL IS VICTIM KIDNAPERS

BOMBAY, Mar. 26.—Widespread attention throughout India has been attracted to the trial which opened here today of nine persons accused of attempting on January 13, to kidnap Mumtaz Begum, beautiful dancing girl and former favorite of the Maharaja of Indore. Several of the accused persons held high positions under the Maharaja and it is alleged the girl, who had escaped from the household of the potentate, had been threatened with abduction unless she returned willingly.  
Abdul Baula, a wealthy Mohammedan merchant, under whose protection the girl was at the time of the crime, was killed in the attempt to prevent her abduction.  
Sensational revelations concerning persons in high quarters have been predicted in connection with the trial in which include Shafiq Ahmed who was the risaldar (commander) of the Indore mounted police; Sham Raon Dige, captain of the Indore air force and Anand Rao Phanse, adjutant general of the Indore state forces. The others are holders of minor positions in the Indore government.  
Mumtaz who lay in a hospital for weeks suffering from knife wounds which disfigured her face and who has been closely guarded since the attempted kidnaping because of repeated anonymous threats was called as the first witness for the prosecution.

Mumtaz testified she had first entered the household of the Maharaja as a singing and dancing girl and later lived there for nine or ten years as his mistress, giving birth to a child who died in infancy. Finally, discovering she was no longer the favorite of the potentate, she escaped through the aid of a policeman and sought Baula's protection.  
Later, the girl added, she was threatened with dire punishment unless she returned to the Maharaja's establishment and there were several attempts at abduction which culminated in the affair of January 13, in which Baula was killed.
