### TESTS MEDICAL LAW.

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 25.—To the Editor: A press dispatch from Winnipeg in the News-Review of March 23d tells of a Christian Science practitioner of that city having been convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to four months in prison for the death of a twelve-year-old child, who died there of diphtheria last November, but it omits to give any further particulars.

The case is not one involving moral turpitude or intentional disobedience to law, the moral and general standing of the practitioner not having been questioned. His conviction rests upon a legal interpretation of a medical practice act of the province of Manitoba, which is one of the very few that have not as yet accorded treatment by prayer some form of legal recognition. In this particular instance the parents of the child objected to the use of anti-toxin because of a former experience, choosing rather to rely upon Christian Science. The case is therefore another trying-out of the question of compulsory medicine versus medical and religious freedom.

### SUPER METHOD IN REFINING IS USED

"Quality—which is found in General gasoline—is not there through some freak coincidence or mere luck, but was hit upon after several years of experimenting by the General Petroleum Corporation," states R. G. Bowman, manager of the General Petroleum Corporation in Oregon. "It is a direct result of what we consider to be a super method of refining, which we have used since our product was first placed on the market."

Mr. Bowman points out that the primary operation in the refining of crude oil is one of distillation. Petroleum is a combination or mixture of what are chemically known as hydrocarbons, all having different boiling points and gravities. In determining the specific gravity of an oil, its weight is compared with an equal volume of pure water and the higher the Baume gravity of the oil, the lower will be its boiling point.

"By the method used by the General Petroleum Corporation, known as the Trumble Patent Continuous Process, crude oil is pumped in a steady stream through a series of pipe retorts set in a bricked furnace, where the oil is heated to the desired temperature—from 400 to 600 degrees Fahrenheit, depending upon the type of crude oil and the number of products to be made. From the retort this heated oil is flowed into a large cylinder set on end, where the vapors separated by the heating pass off through a series of condensers fed by a constant supply of cooling water. The unevaporated oil falling to the bottom of the cylinder is run into tanks and is known as 'residual' or fuel oil.

In the first condensers, where the vapors are hottest, the heaviest portions of the vapors condense back into liquid form and are run off as a heavy distillate called diesel oil, or furnace oil. The next condensers produce the next heaviest distillate called stove oil and kero distillate. This may be redistilled and treated to produce kerosene.

"The final condensers in which the vapors are coolest and therefore the lightest are supplied with the largest amount of cooling water, and in these the gasoline is redistilled. The excellence of the gasoline depends upon the care with which the temperatures are maintained in the various condensers and the completeness with which condensation is carried out. "The first process of refining is called 'topping,' and a re-distilling or treating is usually necessary to make it marketable. The treatment frequently used on gasoline after it has been made to the desired specifications, is the acid and alkali method. By this use, the introduction of acid into the oil raises its temperature considerably and has a tendency to vaporize off some of the lighter gases, and the agitation which is necessary further increases this loss.

"In making General gasoline, however, we use what is known as the 'doctor solution' method, and by this there is no change in the temperature of the gasoline. The agitation necessary is done in tight vessels kept cool so that there is no noticeable loss of that important part of the gasoline which is so necessary for the easy starting of motors."
