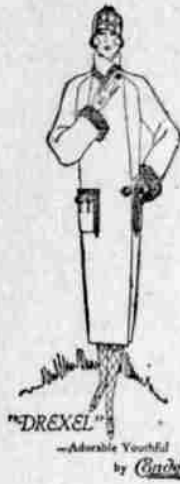

### ROADS OUT OF CITY TO BE IMPROVED

The roads in West Roseburg and North Roseburg leading out of the city to the east and west, are to be improved in the near future.

The city council has made arrangements with the county court, whereby the county's road machinery will be used as soon as available to scarify and scrape the roads and put them in condition. The two roads are in poor condition at this time and the city council has been trying for some time to get them repaired, but the county's equipment has been in use elsewhere but as soon as it can be procured the roads will be improved.

### GOVERNOR GIVEN RIGHT TO APPOINT SPECIAL DEPUTIES

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) SALEM, Ore., March 31.—The authority of the governor to appoint special prosecutors in counties to handle prohibition cases is upheld by an opinion of the supreme court today, written by Justice Hand, dismissing the action of the state, on information of A. J. Moore, district attorney for Deschutes county, against Ross Farnham. The case was an original proceeding in quo warranto.

Farnham was appointed by Governor Pierce as a special prosecutor to take charge of prohibition cases in Deschutes county and disburse all funds provided by law for the enforcement of the prohibition law. The action was instituted to have determined the right of the special prosecutor to exercise these powers. The dismissal is without costs to either party. The supreme court in an opinion by Justice Conhow, allows a motion to dismiss in the case of the Western Land and Irrigation company et al, respondents, against J. Hanfield, et al, defendants and respondents, and O. D. Tell, appellant which was heard in Umatilla county by Judge Phelps. A petition for rehearing was denied in the case of Bickner vs. Bickner.

### GERMAN SOLDIERS DROWNED IN RIVER

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

DETMOID, Germany, March 31.—Fifty members of the German Reichswehr were drowned in the river Weser this morning when a bridge being constructed by pioneers, in connection with the Reichswehr maneuvers collapsed. The victims were part of a column marching in full field equipment which attempted to use the temporary structure.

At 2 o'clock this afternoon 62 privates still were unaccounted for after the pontoon bridge disaster although it is assumed that many were rescued and are being cared for in nearby villages. The pontoon bridge which failed to sustain the marching column of infantry, was constructed over the upper Weser at the point where it joins the rivers Verra and Fulda, between the towns of Hausberg and Wertheim.

Among the missing is one officer. The accident is believed to have been due to the overloading of one of the pontoons.

### AGED SOLDIER PASSES AWAY

Benjamin Streit, who has made his home in West Roseburg for the past twelve years, died at his home on Wharton avenue, at 9:45 o'clock Monday evening.

Mr. Streit was the father of Mrs. T. W. Delaney, George M. Hess and Frank Streit, of this city. He also has two daughters in the east, Mrs. E. W. Smith, of St. Paul, and Mrs. Tillie Zuehlke, of Minneapolis, Minnesota. The deceased was 86 years and 15 days old at the time of his death. Mr. Streit has been a member of the Methodist Episcopal church for some 40 years or more, and lived a conscientious Christian life, honored and respected by all who knew him.

The funeral services will be held at the Undertaking Parlors, Wednesday afternoon. Interment will be held at the Masonic cemetery.

### SNELL PUMMELS PORTLAND BOXER

WENATCHEE, Wash., March 31.—"Doc" Snell, known here as the "Peshastis phantom" now of Tacoma, last night at Leavenworth won a technical knockout over Sammy Gordon of Portland in the second round of a scheduled six round bout. Gordon went down twice under a terrific attack in the first frame and Referee O'Keefe stopped the bout in the middle of the second round when Gordon was unable to put up a defense. Snell pummeled Gordon at will.

Snell and his manager Joe Waterman were due to leave today for New York City, where Snell is scheduled to box Irish Johnny Curtin in Tex Rickard's last show at Madison Square Garden after which the building will be torn down.

### CIRCUS TO PASS UP ROSEBURG THIS YEAR

Barnes circus which usually visits Roseburg each year, will jump from Ashland to Cottage Grove, eliminating Roseburg from its itinerary, according to "Dusty" Rhodes, advance man who stopped in Roseburg today to visit with Roy Bellows, western representative. The circus is coming through in May and is making long jumps in an effort to get into Canada early in the season. It will be in Cottage Grove on May 5. Last year, near the close of the season, the circus experienced a stroke of hard luck when forty horses were burned to death. The number of horses for this year, however, greatly exceeds the number carried last year, and 65 of the animals appear in one act.

### DECLARES HE WAS ENGAGED TO GISH

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) NEW YORK, March 31.—A story of an unofficial engagement to marry Lillian Gish, which later became official and then was broken, has been told in federal court by Charles H. Duell, who is seeking to compel the screen star to make pictures only for his company.

While Duell was testifying yesterday about the engagement Miss Gish covered her face with her handkerchief and some spectators thought they saw tears in her eyes. Before the trial she said that the claim of Duell that they had been engaged was "unwarranted presumption."

He testified that the "unofficial" engagement began in June 1923, directly after he had been separated from his wife. After his divorce he said, the engagement became "official" and it was broken on April 2, 1924, by mutual consent. He said he had given Miss Gish a ring.

Duell said he met Miss Gish in 1922. He told of making loans to her.

"Her personal affairs were not in good condition," he said. I know she had worked many years and reached the conclusion that what she had made in the past had been very largely spent."
