HINDU IS HELD FACING MURDER

EL CENTRO, Cal., April 2. — Two Imperial valley business men are dead and a Hindu farmer is in the county jail on suspicion of murder as a result of what authorities believe was a dispute over the disposal of a lettuce crop near Calipatria, north of here, late yesterday.

Parker Singh, the Hindu, who has been a lettuce grower in the valley for nine years, is alleged to have opened fire during the dispute, putting a bullet through the heart of Victor K. Sterling, real estate operator and then killing John B. Hargard, Sterling's associate and owner of a fruit express company. Before he was arrested and brought to El Centro, the Hindu attempted to shoot Herbert J. Thornberg, an associate of the slain men, officers say, but the shot went wild and he was disarmed before he could fire again.

JAILED INDIAN KILLS MEXICAN WHO CHIDED HIM

**Aged Medicine Man Held
for Murder of Papoose
Becomes Enraged.**

CRUSHED HIS SKULL

**Grabs Table Leg and Beats
Tormentor to Death—
Bodies of Woman,
Babe Exhumed.**

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
CORTEZ, Colo., Apr. 2.—An aged Indian medicine man, of a western Colorado tribe was a prisoner in this ancient town today while his "pale face" brothers sat in motion the laws of civilization to exact the penalty for the death of a papoose buried alive as a sacrifice to sacred tribal rites.

The prisoner, Mormon Joe, today faced charges of the federal and state governments as an accessory to the burial of the Indian babe, and as the slayer of Joseph Chavez, a Mexican cellmate whom he clubbed to death in the Cortez jail late yesterday. The slain man's son-in-law, Pete Nay is charged with the murder of the infant.

Federal officers armed with warrants were to arrive from Denver today to take charge of the investigation of the burial ceremony as the alleged crime was committed on an Indian reservation, where the Washington government has jurisdiction. The state however, probably will prosecute for the killing of Chavez as the crime occurred outside the reservation boundary. The government charged that Pete Nay, whose squaw recently succumbed to illness, wrapped the body in a blanket with the living child and sent them both to their eternal resting place "upon the coercion of Mormon Joe."

—a coroner's jury yesterday charged. The bodies were exhumed on the reservation, where they were buried last week. The verdict of the inquest was that the infant was buried alive and that its mother died of natural causes.

Both Mormon Joe and Pete Nay are in jail here under guard of the sheriff.

Late yesterday Chavez chided the medicine man with remarks about the death of the Indian child and told him that he, too, soon would die for the crime.

While the Mexican, an alleged bootlegger, sat reading in his cell the infuriated Indian secured a leg from the table and crushed his tormentor's skull with it. Two other prisoners interfered but Chavez was dead. According to authorities, Mormon Joe and Pete Nay will be taken before the state grand jury at Durango on charges of murder and probably be held for action by the federal grand jury at Durango next Tuesday.
