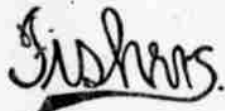

RUM SMUGGLING FISHING SMACK BURNED BY CREW

(Associated Press Licensed Wire.)
SAN FRANCISCO, April 3.—A blaze from stem to stern of the 70 foot fishing launch 16-W 2247, out of San Pedro, Cal., was taken as a liquor smuggling prize by the coast guard cutter Tanager after an exciting chase shoreward from a position off Plebeon Point, 45 miles south of here early today, but sank while she was being towed into port by the government craft.
The Tanager first sighted the launch about midnight. Heedless of the order to stop, the launch turned shoreward and the cutter followed. Soon the launch burst into flames and came to a stop and her crew of two leaped overboard. They swam to the cutter, and gave the names of Fred Sundt and Robert Henderson.
Captain Charles M. Lucas drew up alongside and sent two boarding parties on to the blistering decks, one to remove liquor, and the other to fight the fire.
After about 100 cases had been removed to the cutter, the burning launch settled in the water, dousing the flames.
Sundt and Henderson were placed under arrest on a Volstead Act charge.
Sundt said that the launch was but a few days out of San Pedro, but he refused to divulge the origin of the liquor cargo.

SHEPHERD STILL FIGHTS

CHICAGO, April 3.—A third effort to get William D. Shepherd out of jail on bail was begun today when his counsel made a motion for bail before Circuit Judge William D. Brothers. Two such efforts were unsuccessful before Chief Justice Jacob Hopkins of the criminal court.
Judge Brothers upon motion being made by Attorney William Scott Stewart, representing Shepherd who is under indictment charged with the murder of his foster son, William N. McClintock, said he was not disposed to hear the bail motion without conferring with Chief Justice Hopkins. Shepherd was not in court when the motion was offered and State's Attorney Crowe delayed the matter by insisting that the defendant be brought from jail.
Judge Brothers finally deferred the hearing until 2 p. m. to allow time to confer with Chief Justice Hopkins.
CHICAGO, April 3.—Circuit Judge William M. Brothers refused today to entertain a motion to admit to bail William D. Shepherd, charged with murder. Chief Justice Hopkins in the criminal court twice previously refused bail pleas.

A. F. Fife, the advertising solicitor, arrested here Saturday night charged with forgery, and who has been incarcerated while an investigation was made relative to alleged violations of the white slavery law, was released from custody today. As Rev. Clerly, whose endorsement was forged to the check, filed no criminal charge nothing was done on the local courts, and as the government apparently did not desire to prosecute the local authorities, the check was returned to the man from custody.
