JUDGE LINDSEY'S JOB IN BALANCE

DENVER, Col., April 4.—Ben B. Lindsey's service in the Denver juvenile court, which he founded 24 years ago, today hangs in the balance.

Legal contest entered by Royal B. Graham, before District Judge Julius H. Moore for a recount of the votes cast for juvenile judge in last November's election today had given Graham a lead of four votes in the 19 precincts which came under the scrutiny of the court. There are 211 precincts in Denver. Lindsey was declared elected last November by a majority of 117 votes over Graham, his opponent for the bench. Two hundred pencil-marked ballots thrown into the contest by attorneys are expected to prove the deciding factor in the present proceedings.

Attorneys for Judge Lindsey contend that even though Graham is declared the winner, he cannot take office legally because, they allege, he did not have the residential requirement necessary to election.

YOST URGES MORE UNIVERSITY GAMES
(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
MILWAUKEE, Wis., April 4.—There is need for more games and physical exercises in the universities of America, so that students will be products of all-around development, instead of a one-sided one, Fielding H. Yost, director of athletics at the University of Michigan, said today in an address before the Milwaukee university club.

If one is to render useful services, it is necessary that he have a keen intellect, a sound and enduring body, be fundamentally sound in character—dependable, reliable, trustworthy and honest.—with the right attitude toward life and his place in society," Yost said. "Certainly the development of the intellect alone would not be of much benefit to the individual or society; if character, health and endurance were neglected.

"Is it not true that if we are to have the right type of development in our universities a program for the development of all three of these parts of the individual must be provided. To develop a man mentally and not look after his physical well being would only make him a charge on society and certainly if a man is developed intellectually and physically and his moral qualities are all wrong, he is only a menace to society. His development would then serve only to fire him to do greater damage.

"We do not need fewer and less physical exercises in our schools and universities, but for the majority we need more. We need a sense of proportion in the development of boys and girls in our educational institutions, so that the individuals that leave our schools and universities will be products of an all-around development and not a one-sided one."

for of the government fleet. Bringing suit both as a party directly concerned and as a tax payer, the Pacific Mail declared in its petition that the sale not only would violate the merchant marine act but that the shipping board's action in regard to its bid for the 5 vessels had been an "arbitrary refusal" to consider it after the company had offered to modify the bid as to provisions held illegal by board counsel.

In the face of the company's representation that sale of the ships it now operates would result in "irreparable loss, injury and damage," to it, Chairman O'Connor of the board declared that if the injunction is made public he personally would favor cancelling the company's operating contract, former Secretary George E. Chamberlain of Oregon interpreted the chairman's statement as a willingness to drive the Pacific Mail out of business in any case, but would not indicate what legal steps if any, the company might take if the board adopted such a course.

SOLDIERS GIVEN 40 YEARS IN THE PEN

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)
HONOLULU, Apr. 4.—Private Paul Crouch, 21st Infantry, stationed at Schofield Barracks, was sentenced to forty years imprisonment and given a dishonorable discharge from the army after a general court martial found him guilty of attempting to organize the revolutionary communist league among soldiers stationed at the barracks.

Crouch was charged with being the leader of the self-styled ring of communists and was charged with having issued propaganda under the pretext of being a teacher of Esperanto at army schools.

The plot was tipped by the authorities when Private Crouch openly defied communism through a local newspaper. It is reported that several others will be court martialed on the same charge of which Crouch was found guilty yesterday.
