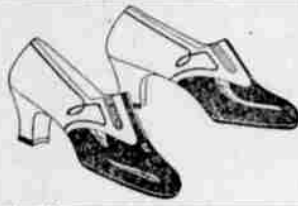

HAL DONAHEY'S JOY RIDE UNDER INVESTIGATION

(Associated Press Lead Wire.) COLUMBUS, O., April 8.—Hal Donahey, 17-year-old son of Governor Vic Donahey, and Miss Lillian Vogel, 15-year-old Zanesville girl, who disappeared from her home Sunday night, and who was brought to Columbus by young Donahey today were turned over to juvenile court officials of Muskingum county at Zanesville by Mrs. Vic Donahey. The girl is a ward of the court. According to the girl's story, which she told in the presence of Governor and Mrs. Donahey and Hal, she and Hal had been acquainted about 30 days. She said that she and Hal and another boy and girl took a ride Sunday night and returning home about 11:30 o'clock she was afraid to enter her aunt's home where she was staying and that on her own suggestion Hal brought her to Columbus. Arriving here near midnight she spent the remainder of the night at The Friend's home. Monday she went to the rooming house. She said the governor's son had been a perfect gentleman and that she considered that he had rendered her a service in bringing her to Columbus.

COLUMBUS, O., April 8.—Investigation of the alleged connection of Hal Donahey, 17-year-old son of Governor Donahey, with the disappearance of Lillian Vogel, 15, of Zanesville, was reopened today with indications of sensational developments.

While only a brief announcement was made by the governor's office, it was indicated that the facts are not as represented to the governor by young Donahey Monday night, when it first became known that the girl was missing from her home.

Miss Vogel is in Columbus, and she was brought here Sunday night by Hal Donahey, it was announced at the governor's office at noon today.

The girl is in a Columbus rooming house. It was presumed that she will be taken back to Zanesville by her mother, who was en route to Columbus at noon today. The chief executive dispatched Hal and James W. Huffman, his executive secretary, to Zanesville to probe statements made there placing his son in a compromising position.

Mrs. Donahey, her son, Hal, and Miss Vogel left the executive mansion at three o'clock this afternoon for Zanesville, where the boy and girl will be turned over to the juvenile authorities. Mrs. Donahey took the girl to the executive mansion from a rooming house. Probate Judge Clarence Graham said that "a thorough investigation will be made of the disappearance of Miss Vogel, who was a ward of the Muskingum county court. If arrests are warranted they will be made, no matter who is involved."

KIDNAPPED BABE FOUND AFTER A TWO YEAR SEARCH

NEW YORK, April 8.—Prosecutor Hart of Bergen county, New Jersey, informed New York police headquarters today from Hackensack that Mr. and Mrs. Peter McKenzie had positively identified a child known as Mildred Groff, found in Englewood, N. J., as their daughter Lillian, who was kidnapped in front of an Eighteenth St. department store in Manhattan when she was 3 months old. In the county-wide search for her, clues were found in Aberdeen, Brooklyn, Philadelphia, Washington and other cities. Boy Scout girl guides and the Salvation Army joined in the search. The child identified by Mr. and Mrs. McKenzie as their own, had been living in Englewood as Mildred Groff, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. V. P. Groff. Prosecutor Hart told Captain Ayres, head of the missing persons bureau of the New York Police Department, that the identification by the McKenzies was satisfactory for Bergen county officials. Captain Ayres said the Bergen county prosecutor also informed him that Mrs. Groff had said the girl was not her own but that it was given to her by a "Dr. Green." This "Dr. Green," Captain Ayres said, was quoted by Prosecutor Hart as saying that he had obtained the girl when a young babe from an unmarried mother named Sullivan. Mr. Hart informed him, Captain Ayres said, that this reputed mother of the child could not be located.

OCEAN'S VAGARIES TAKE LIFE, CREATES RIVERS

NEW YORK, April 8.—Strange changes in ocean currents along the west coast of South America have caused thousands of fish and sea birds to be killed and desert lands to be converted into tropical jungles by torrential rains.

The phenomena were caused by warm currents flowing southward along the coast from Southern Ecuador to Northern Chile instead of the cold current from the Antarctic ocean which prevents any rainfall, it was reported by Captain George S. Dexter of the steamer Santa Lilia.

Jelly fish died because of the warm water and birds which fed upon them were poisoned, the captain said.

The warm water caused torrential rains in Northern Chile and Ecuador. Whole villages were washed away. Captain Dexter continued, and there are three new rivers at Talara, Peru, ordinarily a desert, one of which is 17 feet deep.
