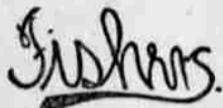

PIERCE'S REQUEST FOR ANOTHER BIG LINK IN HIGHWAY

(Associated Press Local Wire.) SALEM, Ore., April 9.—Governor Pierce will send a telegram to Governor Richardson of California urging him to sign a bill recently passed by the California legislature, placing on the state highway system of that state a road from Heiber, Cal., to Malin, Klamath county, Oregon. This will connect with The Dalles-California highway in Oregon which is to be completed next year. Governor Pierce today received a telegram from his secretary, W. A. Deibel, who is now in California, suggesting that he request the California governor to sign the bill.

Roy Klein, state highway engineer, said today that development of the Heiber-Malin highway and its connection with The Dalles-California highway in Oregon will be of great importance and advantage to Klamath Falls, since it will put that city on a main state highway from California through Oregon, connecting with the Columbia river highway at The Dalles. The Heiber-Malin road branches from the Pacific highway at Rodding, Cal., extends to Heiber, then north to Malin and Klamath Falls.

HUSBAND HOARDED MONEY WIFE CLAIMS

Although her husband had three or four thousand dollars at interest in Roseburg banks, she was compelled to appeal to the Salvation Army for suitable clothing for her children, Mrs. Rosabelle Stovall declares in a divorce complaint filed today against her husband, H. W. Stovall. Mrs. Stovall alleges that she and her husband were married at Sutherland, Tenn., November 25, 1906, and that they are the parents of six children.

Her husband has brutally assaulted her upon numerous occasions, the woman claims, also stating that he has struck her 100 times during 30 days.

Mrs. Stovall claims that her husband, although making from \$4 to \$7 per day as a mason or carpenter, would refuse to provide meat for the table of his family, and would greet her request for food with beatings and cursings, but provided himself with hot food at the noonday hour at some restaurant in town.

She further claims that Christmas gifts were never given by him to herself or any of the children, and that one of the older children was required to quit school because he would not provide tablets and school supplies.

Mrs. Stovall, in her complaint, states that she was forced to provide for herself with money which she secured from the sale of garden truck raised by her self.

She asks for a division of the property interests, real and personal. She is represented by Attorney Elbert Herman.
