NEW YORK, April 10.—Four thousand residents of Charlotte, N. C., cheered when the New York Yankees unleashed a rally in the ninth inning yesterday that conquered Brooklyn 9 to 8, and insured the Manhattanites an even break in the exhibition series with three games to play.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., April 10.—For the first time since he went to the Detroit Tigers, a rookie in the major leagues, Ty Cobb, now leader of that team, today faced the possibility of sitting on the bench and watching his team play the opening game of the season.

ST. LOUIS, April 10.—By winning from Memphis, 8 to 5, at Memphis yesterday, the Browns concluded their Southern training trip. They have been in uniform 28 days and have won eleven out of nineteen games played since the opening of their exhibition season, March 11. It is one of the worst pre-season records made by the Browns in years. The Cardinals trimmed Dallas 10 to 1 while Rogers Hornsby drove out four hits in as many trips to the plate.
