KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., April 10.—Visibly impressed by the determination of homesteaders in the Tule lake section, as well as the optimism of the settlers in the Merrill and Malin units of the Klamath irrigation project, Secretary of the Interior Hubert Work arrived back in Klamath Falls last night from an extensive auto tour east about the reservation. A colorful feature of the afternoon program is a scheduled conference between Mr. Work and the tribal council of the Klamath Indians. This will probably be held under the shade of the stately pines of Klamath agency.

The visit of the cabinet officer and his aides will be brought to an official close at 7 o'clock tonight at a public banquet. Although Secretary Work and Mr. Mead are booked to make the only talks at the banquet, both officials have expressed a desire to listen to what over complaints settlers and water users might wish to make, and the formal program planned by the Chamber of Commerce is expected to turn into a general round-table discussion of irrigation problems in the Klamath district.

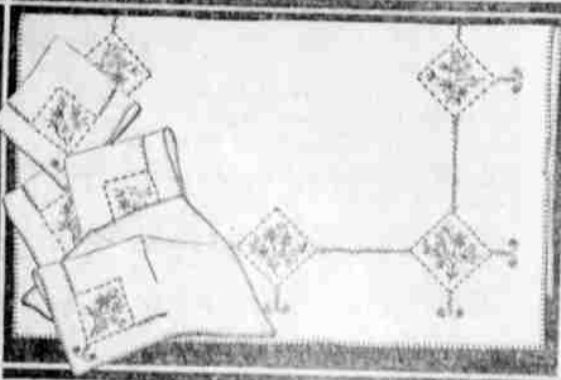
