KLANSMAN MUST STAND TRIAL FOR WRONGING GIRL

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., April 11.—The first legal move of D. C. Stephenson, former Ku Klux Klan grand dragon, to prevent his trial on five indictments charging him with an attack on Miss Madge Oberholtzer, failed today. Demurrers filed by the prosecution in answer to pleas in abatement of the indictments presented by Stephenson's counsel, were sustained by Judge James A. Collins in criminal court.

Eph Inman, chief of counsel for Stephenson, countered with a motion to quash the indictments. Arguments on this motion was set for April 18.

Stephenson is charged with assault and battery with intent to kill, assault and battery with intent to rape, malicious mayhem, kidnapping and conspiracy to commit a felony. While the court action was in progress physicians planned to operate on Miss Oberholtzer, who is in a critical condition. Poison taken following the alleged attack has resulted in an infection which the physicians hoped to relieve through an operation. She has been unconscious for ten days.

taken. It is the judgment of this court that the parole previously granted be revoked and that you be sentenced to the state penitentiary without limitation of time, with a maximum of seven years, this sentence to begin upon termination of the previous sentence.

Thompson was indicted yesterday on the charge of larceny of \$2,000 of public funds, following his sentence and parole a week ago on the charge of straggling only \$931. At the time of his parole the real amount of his delinquencies were not known to the authorities until a complete examination of his books had been made.

Thompson was employed as cashier in the state treasurer's office under State Treasurers O. H. Huff and Jefferson Myers. At the beginning of the administration of T. H. Kay, Thompson was recalled in the usual readjusting of positions that follows a change of administration. COPPER DAM OF BURN SIDES BRIDGE CAVES IN—WORKMEN ENRUT

PORTLAND, Ore., April 11.—A copper dam at the east approach of the new Burnside Bridge across the Willamette river here collapsed this morning without warning. Two workers, Charles Lougren and George Sway, at work 35 feet below the surface, were thrown upward by the pressure of water from below and escaped with a few bruises. Construction of a new copper dam will require six weeks, delaying steel work at that part of the bridge for that length of time.

Divers are at work trying to learn the cause of the accident.
