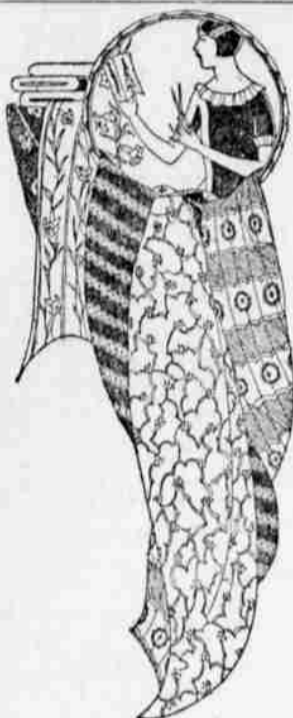

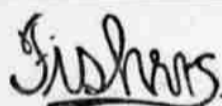

LIGHTING LAW TO BE EXPLAINED AT MEETING TONIGHT

T. A. Rafferty, chief of the State Motor Vehicle Department, accompanied by lighting engineer of that division, will arrive late this afternoon to conduct a meeting tonight at Hotel Empqua, where the new state lighting law will be explained. The meeting is open to mechanics, officers of the law, dealers and other persons concerned with the automobile industry or the enforcement of the law. The rules will be explained in detail and information will be given regarding the procedure necessary to equip cars to comply with the new standards. The meeting will be in the nature of an instructive lecture with the use of devices and screens to demonstrate how the work is done and will give instructions relative to the installation of adjusting stations.

CHEERS, PRAISE GREET BLIMP ON HER SAFE RETURN

PULHAM, Eng., April 17.—To the cheers of British army officers, soldiers, workers, and groups of spectators, the army dirigible R-33 returned home safely shortly after 2 o'clock this afternoon after her twenty-eight hour battle with the elements over the east coast of England, and a storm-swept north sea. The runaway craft torn away from her moorings at the Pulham air station yesterday during and of the fiercest gales in recent years.

A favorable wind allowed the sorely distressed crew of the R-33 to start their ship homeward from a point near the Dutch coast after daylight and she made a slow steady flight across the North sea, which yesterday she had passed over in the opposite direction, driven onward by the wind. Heavy clouds went up to them as the ship passed low over the shore line. An excited crowd had waited on the shore since the big craft with her damaged prow dropping low was swept out to sea yesterday.

The British air ministry officials are loud in their praise of the stability of the R-33, which withstood the heaviest buffeting to which it had been subjected and it is their opinion that the crew gained much valuable experience during their forced journey. With many instruments distributed through the ship for the purpose of gaining data for airship construction, valuable information is expected to be obtained as a result of the runaway flight.

He assures that France intends to regulate its obligations but he will negotiate closely as to terms and perhaps as to amounts. An indication of how he regards the war debts, he found in his speech of February 19 on the occasion of his "rehabilitation" after the armistice in which he said:

"Our country would not have met the crazy financial chaos which continued long after the armistice if over-tiring industry had not thrown on her shoulders the burden of advancing the war cost of repairing the war damages, with the partial payment of some of them and the weight of the inter-allied debts."
