GRAIN ELEVATOR REDUCED TO ASHES LOSS \$2,500,000

CHICAGO, April 23.—Possible incendiarism in the fires which destroyed two grain elevators under lease to the Grain Marketing Company with a loss estimated at \$2,500,000, and two blazes which caused damage of \$50,000 or more in the Hibbard, Spencer, Harbott & Company building, were under investigation today.

CHICAGO, April 23.—More than 2,000,000 bushels of corn and oats belonging to the grain market from the corporation were destroyed in a fire which started shortly before midnight, burning two wooden elevators and threatening an industrial section on the south side before it was subdued early today.

The loss was estimated at \$2,500,000 by E. F. Rosenbaum, president of the Rosebush Grain Corporation, through which the elevators were leased to the farmers' co-operative organization. Destruction of the grain he estimated at \$1,500,000 and of the structures, among the oldest wooden elevators here, at \$750,000. The losses were adequately covered by insurance, he said.

Heading grain, pouring into the south branch of the Chicago river, stopped the stream and threatened shipping, forcing withdrawal of two fire tugs.

Search was started after the fire for an aged watchman and his wife, believed to have been quartered in one of the buildings.

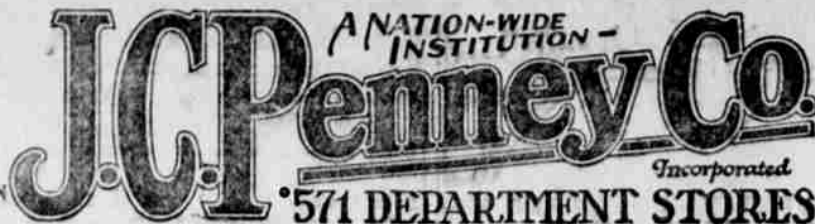

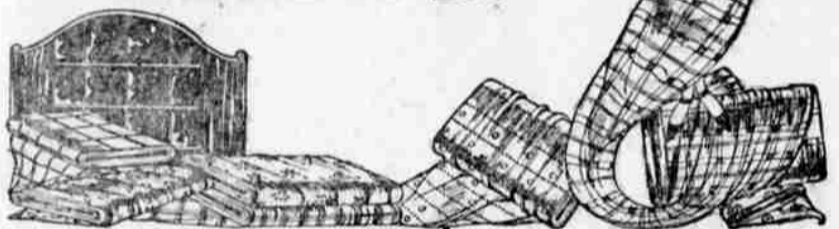
