DEATH STALKS DURING CAROUSEL OF TROUPE (Associated Press Leased Wire.)

TORONTO, April 24.—Pay Dainton's party, celebrating the hundredth presentation on the road of "The Dream Girl," a musical comedy in which she is starring, was followed by the death of a member of her company and the arrest, for violation of the Ontario temperance act, of two negro musical comedy stars, who were among her guests.

Carl W. A. Lynn, 42, died last night from a fractured skull which surgeons said he apparently suffered when he fell down stairs in his hotel.

Manager Barton of the company told authorities that he left the party with Lynn shortly before daybreak, accompanying the actor to his hotel. Several hours later Lynn was found at the stairs in the hotel Stacey, in his street clothes with a deep gash in his scalp and a fractured skull.

Garden tools at Powell's. MEN DECLARED DEAD ASK COURT FOR RULING (Associated Press Leased Wire.)

NEW ORLEANS, La., April 24.—A mandate of the state supreme court will be necessary to restore legal life to two residents of this city. Both have been entered on the official lists of the board of health as dead, and although they are living, have lost the right to vote and other advantages because of their legal status.

The body of a man found in a gas filled room of a boarding house was identified by a son as Frank Muller. A body found in the Mississippi river was identified by relatives as Charles W. Burdette.

While preparations were being made for their interment under those names, the two men made their appearance alive. They immediately called on the health authorities to remove them from the list of dead. This was refused on the ground that once entered on this list they must remain there until ordered erased by the supreme court.
