We are having this matter brought to your attention very briefly in handling the shipments for 2600 wool growers in this and other states during the past four years. It is very seldom that we find any country scales that even closely check up with our U. S. licensed scales, which are tested twice daily.

There is absolutely no reason or excuse for inaccurate scales, says Mr. Spence. The state department will test them for any elevator, warehouseman or others without charge.
