VON HINDENBURG WILL WEAR MEDALS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) HANOVER, May 2.—The president-elect, Field Marshal Von Hindenburg, expects to arrive in Berlin on May 11, remaining at the chancellery palace until after his inauguration on the following day. Hindenburg citizens are planning a torchlight parade in honor of the president-elect Thursday. In response to a letter of congratulation from Dr. Wilhelm Marx, the unsuccessful candidate of the republican bloc, the field marshal sent a reply in which, after thanking Dr. Marx for his felicitations he said: "I am happy to note that you take the same standpoint, which I would have held in the event of your victory at the polls. Your wishes for our sorely troubled fatherland coincide with mine. May they be fulfilled through the unselfish and unifying work of all to whom Germany is dearer than political party."

The delicate problem as to whether he should wear a frock coat or a military uniform at his inauguration is said to have been solved by Field Marshal Von Hindenburg. According to the present plans, he will wear a Prince Albert, but with it, a number of war medals.

FIND OLD SKELETON

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) MEDFORD, Oregon, May 2.—While plowing last Wednesday on the Luke Ryan ranch on the Delta Creek near Medford, George Croft unearthed a human skeleton. Examination lead to the belief that it was probably that of an Indian, and difficult to estimate the length of time it had been buried, although Coroner Conger believes for 100 years. A hunter's knife of Indian type made from black flint about four-and-a-half inches in length and four inches wide, was also found with the remains. Coroner Conger investigated the matter and brought the skeleton to Medford where it will be placed on exhibition.

DUNCAN CELL YIELDS PEPPER AND SIX SAWS

(Continued from page 1.) immediately thrown into the double locked cell with Duncan, and will be placed in solitary confinement each night. He has spent the greater part of the day protesting against such treatment, and insists that he be furnished with hot water for a bath, and promises the officers with all kinds of dire punishment if the sanitary conditions of the jail are not improved at once. He is even preparing to appeal to the governor, because of the lack of proper bathing facilities he has informed the officers. District Attorney Gordon stated this morning that Hudson's case will be taken before the grand jury and it is quite probable that a charge of aiding a prisoner to escape, will be lodged against him. The law provides in such cases that the penalty may be equal to that of the prisoner to whom such aid was given, and if convicted of the charge Hudson may receive a very stiff sentence. The officers state that they have been informed by Hudson that he previously served a term in the Washington state prison at Walla Walla on a charge of violating the prohibition law. The grand jury will meet on Monday, May 18 and at that time will consider the charges against Duncan and against Hudson. Circuit Court will meet on May 25.

MAY CLOSE WILLAMETTE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) PORTLAND, Ore., May 2.—Closing of the Willamette river to commercial fishing is advocated by Captain A. E. Burdick, state game warden in his monthly report to the game commission. This would only be permanently effected, Burdick states through constitutional amendment setting the river aside to remain forever a trolling and sea stream, thus barring any succeeding legislation from throwing the river open to commercial fishing.
