GOV. TIMBER SOLD AT LAND OFFICE

Eight tracts of government timber located in Coos, Lane and Josephine counties were sold here today at public sale by the Roseburg land office. The sale netted the government \$43,521.79, approximately twenty-two million feet of timber being disposed of. The purchasers were as follows:

Dennis McCarthy, of Marshfield, 2,800,000 feet of timber in Coos county, \$6,225.

Ernest A. Folsom, of Coquille, 5,500,000 feet of timber in Coos, \$1,225.

Claude D. Rorer, of Eugene, 1,750,000 feet of timber in Lane county, \$5,260.

Elmer W. Spaulding, of Grants Pass, 1,900,000 feet of timber in Josephine county, \$4,195.

George S. Gohdro, of Coquille, 1,450,000 feet of timber in Coos county, \$2,793.

Jesse E. Norton, of Coquille, 1,580 feet of timber in Coos county, \$2,160.

Jesse D. Clinton, of Myrtle Point, 2,300,000 feet of timber in Coos county, \$5,116.

George S. Gohdro, of Myrtle Point, 5,000,000 feet of timber in Coos county, \$12,280.

With the exception of the one tract in Lane county and the one in Josephine county, the tracts were all Coos Bay Wagon road grant lands. The two exceptions were G. & C. railroad grant lands. There was competition only on the last named bid, the price being raised \$100 by the successful purchaser. Much of the timber was Port Orford cedar.

YOUNG AUTO THIEF HAS NARROW ESCAPE IN LEAP FROM ROAD

Myron Hansley, alias Joe Healy, who gives his age as 17 years, was arrested this morning charged with the theft of an auto belonging to Frank H. Thompson, a traveling man for the Forbes supply company. The car was stolen from the rear of the Hudson Electric Store late Sunday night, and was wrecked near Myrtle Creek, being driven off the

highway at the big slide and into about 20 feet of water.

Hansley, according to his confession to Sheriff Starmer, picked up the car here about 8 p. m. and started south. Near Myrtle Creek he noticed a car following him, with glaring headlights and thought that the officers were pursuing him. He speeded the car up to its limit, and at 67 miles an hour struck the temporary road around the slide, near Myrtle Creek. The big car, a Nash roadster, leaped from the road, when it struck the bump and rolled down the steep embankment and into deep water.

Hansley went down with the car, but finally worked his way out and reached the surface, swimming to shore. He went on into Myrtle Creek, where he told Marshall Griffith that he had been pushed off the road by a car. He was cut and bruised, and soaking wet, and the officer gave him a place in the jail, reporting the matter to Sheriff Starmer. This morning when indications of a wreck were found near the slide, Sheriff Starmer ordered the boy held, but he had already been released. However, he was picked up about four miles south of Myrtle Creek. He confessed the theft, and claimed that he was alone. However, as the car is being raised it is being carefully searched to determine whether or not there are indications of a companion. It is possible, Sheriff Starmer stated, that Hansley might have had a companion who was drowned in the wreck, and if any evidence is found that there was another person, the boy may be dragged.

Hansley, it is stated, is wanted at Chehalis, Washington, for breaking parole at the reformatory. He has served two terms in the reform school, the boy says.
