MEXICAN WAR VET AT SOLDIERS HOME

Robert Starkey, aged 96 years, one of the few remaining veterans of the Mexican war, has arrived in the Oregon Soldiers home and expects to spend the remainder of his years of life in that home.

Mr. Starkey fought in the Mexican war between the years of 1846 and 1848. He cast his first vote for Franklin Pierce for president.

During the past years Mr. Starkey has made his home near Myrtle Point, where he was very well known. He has written a good deal for publication, both prose and poetry, and many of his articles have had wide circulation. Last year he sustained a broken hip bone, necessitating an operation which kept him in the hospital for some time. Although nearly recovered from this operation, his age and infirmity make it desirable for him to have the care obtainable at the Soldiers Home hospital.
