MRS. SHEPHERD IS OUT ON BAIL

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
 CHICAGO, May 8.—Mrs. Julie G. Shepherd, charged with aiding her husband William D. Shepherd to kill their ward, William Nelson McClintock, orphan millionaire and his mother, Mrs. Emma Nelson McClintock has been released on \$5,000 bond pending grand jury action. Although she had been given until today to furnish bond and had been released on her own word, late yesterday she appeared before Judge Jacob Hopkins, criminal court chief justice while Mrs. Claudine M. Peterson, a friend, scheduled \$15,000 in real estate on the \$5,000 bond.

Her only expression during the brief court procedure was a reference to Judge Harry Olson, instigator of the coroner's inquest into the death which resulted in the grand jury indictment of Shepherd and recommendations that Mrs. Shepherd be held.

"It is coming to believe the man's mind is gone," she said. "He has an obsession; the Shepherds are his obsession."

SOAP KING OF ENGLAND DIES

 LONDON, May 7.—Viscount Leverhulme, industrial leader and multimillionaire "soap king" succumbed to pneumonia at 4:30 o'clock this morning after a brief illness. He was 74 years old.

As William H. Lever he started work in his youth as a soap cutter but within a few years founded a business of his own and his enterprise assumed world wide importance. He was raised to the peerage in 1922 and combining his wife's maiden name—Rutime—with his own became Viscount Leverhulme.

BRITISH ADMIRAL IS DEATH VICTIM

LONDON, May 7.—Sir Doveton Sturdee, admiral of the fleet, who commanded the British squadron in the battle of Falkland Islands in 1914, and later participated in the battle of Jutland died today. He had been ill for some time.

Entering the navy in 1871, he rose by successive stages to the rank of Rear Admiral in 1908 and was made vice admiral just before the war began. He commanded the Anglo American force in the Samoa troubles in 1898-99. A baronetcy was conferred on him in 1916.

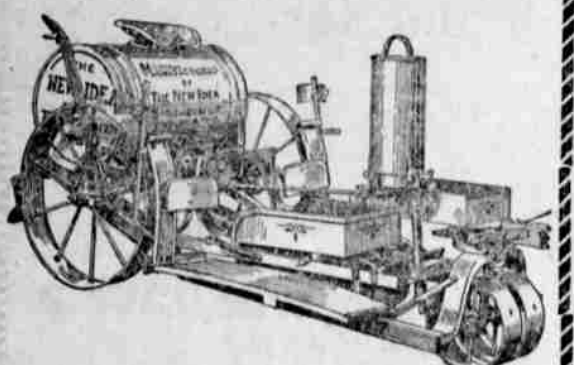
