The suit of Otto Muetzel against D. R. Shambrook and J. G. Hodges, was dismissed this morning upon the motion of Mr. Muetzel's attorney. The case was one in which Mr. Muetzel sought to obtain damages because of what he claimed was illegal restraint and search of his automobile. He filed a motion of prejudice against Judge Hamilton, opposition to any change being voted by the state, on the grounds that a point of law had already been submitted and decided by Judge Hamilton. The case, however, ended today when a motion of voluntary non suit was introduced.
