BOY AUTO THIEF ORDERED TO WORK ON OREGON ROADS

(Associated Press Local Wire.)
MEDFORD, Ore., May 14.—Arno Ritter, 18, a former student in the Benson polytechnic school of Portland, Wednesday plead guilty to stealing an automobile and was sentenced to serve a year in the county jail by Judge C. M. Thomas. The court further ordered that the youth, if arrangements could be made, should work three months on state highways during the summer. "The report I get from the highway work will govern me largely in granting a parole later," the court said. Ritter and two companions were charged and admitted stealing three automobiles, two of the cars were taken from Portland streets; and the third was stolen at Ashland and the trio was arrested at Gold Hill.

BRITISH COLUMBIA CIDER BANNED FROM BEER HALLS

VICTORIA, B. C., May 14.—Decision of Commissioner Davidson of the liquor control board that cider is too dangerous to be sold in beer shops in British Columbia was announced today. The commissioner alleged that "cider is hard to handle. It increases rapidly in alcoholic percentage; in fact it is dangerous stuff; it is liable to go off."
