**AVIATOR IN CITY**

Captain L. H. Young and wife, representing H. G. Broce and company, a Seattle advertising concern, were in the city today. Captain Young was one of the American fliers during the World War, enlisting with the Canadian flying corps in 1915 and being transferred to the U. S. flying corps following the entrance of this country into the struggle. He is the sole survivor of the battle of six American planes and 12 German planes at Verdun. His plane was brought down by the Germans, and he fell several thousand feet, both legs, a shoulder and jawbone being broken.
