Boy Scouts

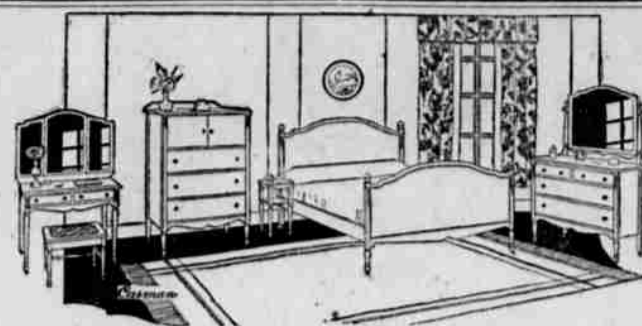
Troop 1 will have a model Boy Scout Camp during the entire carnival at Oak and Rose streets.
