## DEATH AND RUIN IN THE WAKE OF SEVERE STORM

Eastern Colorado and Part  
of Illinois Sustain  
Heaviest Damage.

WIRES ARE CRIPPLED  
18 Houses in One City  
Blown Down—Tornado  
Is Nearly an Hour in  
Its Duration.

DENVER, COLO., May 22.—A trail of debris 75 miles long, remained in Eastern Colorado today as a reminder of the high wind-storm which tore through a dozen villages late yesterday, killing three persons, severely injuring three others and causing thousands of dollars damage to property.

At Boulder, Loren H. Bennett, a carpenter, was killed when a roof on which he was working was blown against a mass of rocks. Two others working on the roof escaped with injuries. A boy of five was drowned in a small lake at Berthoud when the wind overturned a boat in which he and a companion were playing. A seven year old girl was crushed to death at Platteville when an outbuilding was destroyed.

Most of the property loss was to small buildings and to telegraph and telephone lines. The gale lasted for nearly an hour in some places. At Fort Collins it assumed the force of a tornado, but no great damage was reported there.

ST. LOUIS, May 22.—One man was reported killed and considerable property damage done by a severe storm which struck towns in Hamilton and Boone counties in Southern Illinois last night, according to word received here today.

Meager advices said that the storm levelled 18 houses in Herculane, Ill., and caused considerable other property damage. One man is said to have been killed at McLeansboro. Wire communications to the area has been disrupted.

POWERFUL LIQUOR CLIQUE EXPOSED IN BOSTON RAID

BOSTON, May 22.—Federal officers who raided an office in Haymarket Square today, said they believed they had uncovered the biggest rum running organization found in this city since the Volstead act went into operation. Records seized, they said, revealed that three steamers, together with schooners and a fleet of 35 knots speed boats were used and that wholesale bootleggers and persons of prominence throughout the country were the customers.

President W. H. Burton of the Maine Coast and Canada Steamship Company was arrested charged with conspiracy to violate the customs laws.

NEW YORK, May 22.—Als and whisky valued at more than \$150,000 were seized by the customs agents this afternoon on the steamship Boston of the Eastern Steamship Company's line and the freighter Winers. Customs officials said it was the biggest seizure ever made from coastwise vessels.

McADOO REPORTED TRYING TO STAGE 1928 COME-BACK

NEW YORK, May 22.—A Washington dispatch to the New York World today says that, with his eye fixed on the presidential nomination in 1928, W. G. McAdoo is holding a series of political conferences with democratic leaders throughout the east. He is due in New York today for a week's visit, the dispatch says, after a consultation in Louisville with Governor Fields and James P. Brown, publisher, and after unobtrusive movements and conversations with social friends only in Washington. He visited with Mrs. Woodrow Wilson and other friends.

The dispatch says that while pronounced efforts are being made to divorce the eastern trip from political atmosphere, back of it is the well founded rumor that McAdoo forces are lining up an effort to abrogate the two thirds vote.
