### THREE VETERANS OF SOLDIERS HOME OBSERVE 93RD BIRTHDAYS THIS YEAR

Hard, out-of-door work, and lots of it, is the recipe for a long life, according to Oliver H. P. Beagle, A. P. Dean, and Frazier Ward, all residents of the Oregon Soldiers Home who this year observe their 93rd birthday. These three men, whose ages summed up total 279 years, are all veterans of wars fought by this country, two of them being Indian war veterans and the other a soldier of the Civil War period.

Beagle has the distinction of being one of the two surviving members of the famous "Covered Wagon" train piloted across the Great Plains in 1842 by Captain Jesse Applegate. He was only 14 years of age at that time, but upon him fell a man's work, and he recalls many of the interesting events of that arduous trip.

He was born in Campbell county, Kentucky, July 6, 1832, and his parents were a part of the Kentucky detachment which joined the Applegate party. Beagle had his duties to perform, and with Peter Burnett, uncle of Judge Burnett of the state supreme bench, and the Applegate brothers, he aided in handling the cattle train. "At Umatilla," he said, "we decided to leave our stock and make the trip down the Columbia by boat. We made an agreement by which we were to leave our cattle at Fort Walla Walla and to receive a like number at Fort Vancouver. We loaded down the stream on rafts and improvised boats, and upon reaching Vancouver found that the cattle we were expected to take were serows, scrub animals, much inferior to the ones we had brought with us, and so we refused to trade and went back the following year to Fort Walla Walla and brought our stock to Tualatin plains, where my parents settled."

The Beagles moved to what is now Forest Grove, about two years after their arrival in Oregon, and were residing there when word came of the gold strike in California. Owens, the man who made the find at Sutter's mill, was one of those who had crossed the plains with the Applegate party, and when his acquaintances heard of this they immediately made preparations to go to California.

The news of the gold strike was brought to Portland by a small steamer, Mr. Beagle relates. "The captain, after bringing his vessel into the harbor, began purchasing all the shovels, picks, axes and such tools that he could find, and when he went to pay for them he handed out bags of gold dust. When he was asked where the dust came from he could find, and when he went on in California, but refused to sell back any of the implements he had purchased, and for a long time there was a great demand for those tools, as the rush started in 1849 from Oregon."

Beagle, his father, Dr. McBrige, Dr. Evans and an "Uncle" rode west side up the party which went to California that year, traveling by pack team. Beagle and his father remained at the mines about six months, and then sailed on the English vessel Jeanette for Astoria, from which place they returned to Forest Grove.

Beagle, leaving Sacramento, Beagle said, they found that P. H. Burnett had been employed to make a survey and lay out a large tract of land in what is now that city. As his share for his work he was given one-half of the land surveyed. He married Beagle and his father a number of lots, at small cost, and it was only a few months later that these same lots were selling at \$20,000 apiece.

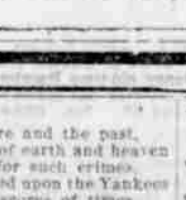

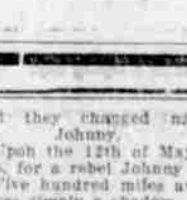
