Grangers now in annual session at Dallas have passed resolutions condemning the practice of selecting the officers of the state legislature prior to the opening of the session. YOUNG OREGONIAN SLAYS RIVAL, GIRL AND THEN HIMSELF

TACOMA, Wash., June 4.—Enraged because he believed that he was losing favor in the eyes of his sweetheart, Victor Hugo Dale, 25-year old Oregon farmer, yesterday evening shot and killed Miss Polinette Quinot, the girl, and his beloved rival, M. E. Monica, 21, a former U. S. Sailor and then turned the gun on himself in his apartment here, according to police. Miss Quinot and Monica are believed to have been instantly killed, but Dale lived long enough to be taken to the county hospital.

MEDFORD, Ore., June 4.—Victor Hugo Dale was a well known resident of Ashland. His parents died about a year ago leaving him a legacy of \$29,000 in city and orchard property. Dale left Ashland six months ago with his victim, according to the Ashland authorities. It is also claimed that the husband of the Polinette woman is in the Veterans Hospital at Tacoma. Her mother-in-law, Mrs. W. C. King, is a resident of Ashland, and formerly lived at Redding, Cal.

EUGENE, Ore., June 4.—Victor Hugo Dale was born in Florence, Oregon, and was adopted as a baby after his mother died by Dr. and Mrs. John S. Dale. He came here last week to find the grave of his mother, which he decorated for Memorial Day, leaving later for Tacoma. He moved about 10 years ago with his foster parents from Florence to Ashland.

Spray the Orchards A light tree fruit crop is the best that Oregon can expect this year. Many people owning but small orchards, knowing the crop is to be light, will conclude that the returns will not justify the expense of spraying, and will therefore wait a better crop before spending their money for spray.

Codling moths, cherry maggot, bark scale, scab and anthracnose can live and thrive well on a short unsprayed fruit crop. Not only do these pests cut down the salable portion of the fruit crop; they bring our fruit into disrepute in distant markets, and so spoil the sale of the clean fruit.

A Historic Name in Oregon
