RAINS DOING MUCH DAMAGE TO FRUIT

Continued rains have seriously affected the fruit crop in Douglas county, and indications at the present time are far from optimistic, according to general reports. Prunes, which a few weeks ago, were already below normal, are being damaged heavily each day the rain continues, until at the present time the indications are that the crop is going to be one of the smallest in the history of the industry in this county. Peaches which had resisted the brown rot much better than the Italians, are now being seriously affected, and with the continuation of the warm rains the rot is spreading very rapidly and causing great losses. Peaches, according to County Horticulturist Carpenter, will probably not run more than 50 percent of a crop, while Italians are probably damaged to such an extent that the harvest will not be more than 25 percent of normal.

In his estimation, The warm rains have been ideal for the spread of brown rot, and sections not damaged by frost have felt heavy losses during the past two weeks from rot. Apples are also being affected by the rains, which prevent the proper sprays from being applied at the time they are needed most. Scab is spreading rapidly, and is so far advanced that control will be exceedingly difficult and, in fact, almost impossible in most places, Mr. Carpenter states.

DALLAS, Ore., June 4.—Investigation here today of a report from Walla Walla, Wash., that Levi Ankney, Jr., grandson of the late Senator Ankney of Washington, was married here two months ago to Klysa Cornett, daughter of a former Prineville, Ore., business man and niece of R. A. Booth, former chairman of the Oregon State Highway Commission, revealed that a license had been granted to Levi Ankney, Jr., and Blanche Cornett, 18, on April 17, and that they were married here the same day.

The marriage ceremony was performed at the Presbyterian manse here by the Rev. J. E. Youel. Ankney was described in the application for the license as a student at Eugene, and Blanche Cornett gave her home as Rieckel, a town four miles east of Dallas.

SLIGHTLY BETTER DAY'S REPORT ON SECRETARY WEEKS

BOSTON, June 4.—Secretary of War, John W. Weeks, who has been in a critical condition at the Massachusetts General Hospital since an operation for gallstones there a week ago, passed the best night he has had since Saturday, according to a bulletin early today from his physicians.

"Secretary Weeks had the best night he has had since Saturday," said the bulletin. "His condition, while not so good at 10 o'clock last night as at 7 o'clock, has again changed slightly for the better. Temperature and pulse normal."

A second bulletin issued shortly after one o'clock said: "There has been no change in the condition of Secretary Weeks since the morning bulletin. He is taking more nourishment and more fluid than in the previous 12 hours."

DEMPSEY AGREES TO MEET WINNER OF FRIDAY'S BOUT

NEW YORK, June 4.—Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion today cabled Billy Gibson, manager of Gene Tunney, that he would meet the winner of the Tunney-Gibson match if proper inducements were made. The cable came from Berlin.

Germany, It follows:

"Will positively meet the winner of the Tunney-Gibbons bout if proper inducement are offered. We both are enjoying the trip immensely. Thanks for the good wishes. Hope you have sold out." (Signed) "Jack Dempsey".

NEW YORK, June 4.—Payment on a basis of more than \$4,400 a minute will be made Gene Tunney and Tom Gibbons for their 15 round heavyweight battle tomorrow night at the Polo Grounds, if the bout goes the limit, it is stated.

The advance sale of tickets indicates an attendance of 60,000 and receipts of \$400,000. Thirty per cent will be the share of Gibbons, giving him \$120,000 or \$8,000 for each three minute rounds. Tunney's share will be \$50,000, representing 20 per cent of the receipts or more than \$5,333 per round. The fighters are resting today after a month's preparation for the battle. Both are pronounced in perfect trim.
