PLANS FOR RESCUE OF AMUNDSEN ARE STILL IN MAKING

(Associated Press Lease Wire.)
NEW YORK, June 5.—The two weeks of grace which Ronald Amundsen allowed before search should begin for him and his Polar expedition are over, and preparations for patrolling the edge of the Arctic ice pack are rapidly being brought to completion.
The Norwegian explorer directed that a sharp lookout should be established along the ice edge if he and his six comrades, who left Spitzbergen for the North Pole in two airplanes on May 21, did not return within a fortnight. He also left sealed instructions, to be opened at about that time, dispatches from Oslo, the Norwegian capital say, but the nature of these instructions is not divulged.
The Norwegian government is dispatching to the north a steamer bearing two naval scout planes which will be unloaded at Kings Bay, Spitzbergen, and flown thence to Wellman Bay, Danes Island, to join Amundsen's supporting crews on the steamers Farm and Hobby. Meanwhile, talk of a search under American auspices is continuing.
Commander Landsowne of the United States naval dirigible Shenandoah, has submitted to the navy department a detailed plan for the operation of his craft in case it is used in a relief expedition.

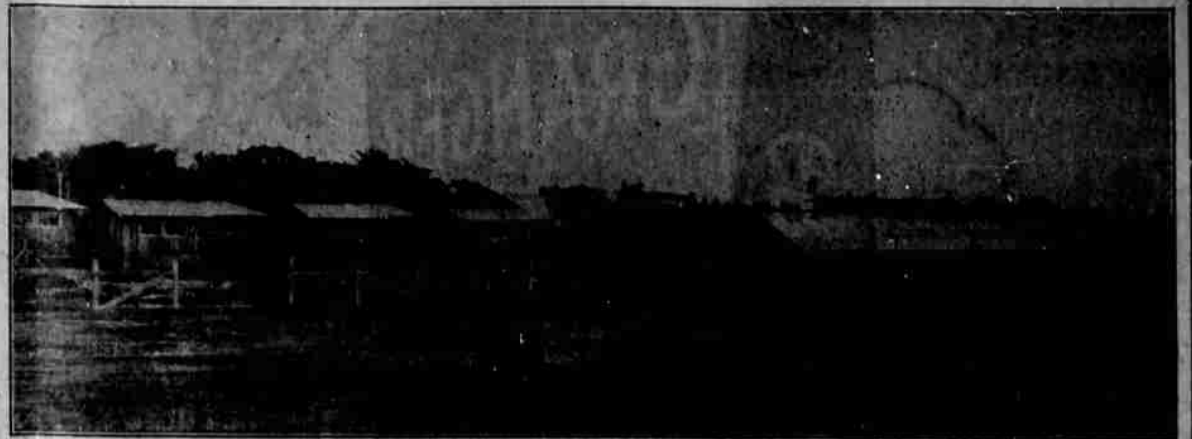
While details of the plan were not given out, it is understood to provide for the establishment of a floating base at Spitzbergen, utilizing for this purpose, the airship tender Patoka.
The Shenandoah, according to the reported plan will fly to Spitzbergen, stopping for fuel at Pullham, England. The navy department reiterated that there have been no appeals for American aid.

EDITORS FIND WAY TO BEDEVIL CENSOR

ROME, June 5.—Italian newspapers devoted to exposing the cause of political parties opposed to Fascism, have initiated a novel method of serving their readers with news and opinions criticizing the government.

Each time an editor of an opposition newspaper is suppressed by the censors, a subsequent edition prints a modest item setting forth the title of the article which caused the suppression. But each title is significant enough to explain the context of the offending article.

For example, the "Mondo" says, "Our second edition was suppressed because of an article entitled 'Responsibility', commenting on a

similar article in the "Popolo" the interrogation of the Fascist Deputy De Marsico about the suppressed because of a comment transfer of certain Milanese magistrates."
