

JUDGE BROWN TO SPEAK AT OAKLAND FOR CELEBRATION

The selection of Judge George M. Brown of the Oregon state supreme court, to give the Fourth of July oration at Oakland has been announced by the celebration committee of the Gobblers. Judge Brown has accepted the invitation to deliver a patriotic address on that occasion and the committee is to be commended on their excellent choice.

Judge Brown is so well known in this section that he will need no introduction. He was a student of the old Umpqua Academy at Wilbur and later was for many years prosecuting attorney for Douglas county. He is not only a polished orator but a man of marked ability along legal lines. The announcement that he will take the leading part in the patriotic program here on the fourth is sure to bring out a large attendance for that event.

The address by Judge Brown will take place at the city park adjoining the racetrack immediately following the street parade which will start at 9:30 in the morning. The Douglas County Concert Band has been secured to head the parade and they will also furnish appropriate music throughout the day. Admission to the park and the morning program will be free and ample parking space will be provided without charge. The grove will afford a splendid place for a picnic dinner for those who come for the entire day. There will be refreshment stands to supply everything that will be desired.

The race program will occupy most of the afternoon but there will also be other special features including a number of athletic contests. Over \$1,000 has been offered in purses for the race events of which there will be seven or eight. The entries will include a number of the fastest horses that have previously appeared on the local track, together with several new ones. In the evening there will be dancing both indoors and out with music by a well known orchestra.

NEW ADMISSION RULING ADOPTED BY UNIVERSITY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, June 9.—(Special).—Students from places outside of Oregon must hereafter be eligible for admission to the university of the state in which they completed high school work before they will be allowed to enter the University of Oregon, according to a ruling just passed by the faculty.

This action was taken as a result of an investigation showing that the scholarship of most of the non-resident students was below the student body average. In order to stop an influx of poor students, the faculty passed this ruling in addition to requiring that outside students comply with university entrance requirements.

The new ruling, it is expected, will probably cost the university approximately 100 students from other states next fall, but will tend to save university expenses. Forty-six of the 70 students who entered the university from one neighboring state failed to meet the entrance requirements of their state university but met the University of Oregon eligibility rules. Entrance requirements of the various coast colleges are not the same. The average grade of the non-residents who had not qualified to enter the university of their home state was 4.22, which is lower than that of the student body. Only 24 of the outside students had grades above the general average of the student body.

NATRON CUT-OFF STEEL LAYING BEGINS JULY 1

BEND, Ore., June 8.—The Southern Pacific will begin laying steel on the Natron cut-off line between Paulina and Odell on July 1, according to information received in Bend this morning. The steel is laid one and a half miles north of Paulina now. The stretch between Odell and Paulina is about 30 miles. The east and west crews on the Cascade tunnel are expected to be cut through within the next three weeks.
