THIRTY MEN ATTEMPT TO LIBERATE MINER

SACRAMENTO, Cal., June 12.—His fate hidden in a fifty-foot cave in the Baltic tunnel of the Alla Combination mine, three miles west of Grass Valley, Robert Hill, 35, Grass Valley miner, at noon today still was a prisoner, says a dispatch to the Sacramento Bee. Three crews of 10 men each today continued their drive to break through the barrier. It was predicted that if he was not caught in the cave-in that he still is alive and that all conditions in the tunnel back of the cave-in would permit him to live for eight days.

Arthur E. Hunt of New York, co-author of the book, "Biology and Human Welfare," from which Scopes taught, has been named to learn the part his book was playing in the case. Mr. Hunt said evolution was dealt with only superficially because the text was intended for elementary students. "Scientists don't speak of the general doctrine of evolution as a theory any more," he added; "it's a fact!"

ACCUSED GIRL FAINTS AS HER LETTER APPEARS

NEW YORK, June 12.—The trial of Dorothy Perkins, 17, for the murder of Thomas Templeton, was halted this afternoon when she collapsed and had to be assisted from the court room.
The girl had been composed throughout the testimony of several relatives as to the events leading up to the tragedy but broke down when Michael Connors, alleged to have been a suitor, was questioned as to his relations with her.
Dorothy slid from her seat in an apparent dead faint, when Assistant District Attorney MacDonald produced a letter alleged to have been written by the girl March 6 to Connors and intercepted by his wife.
