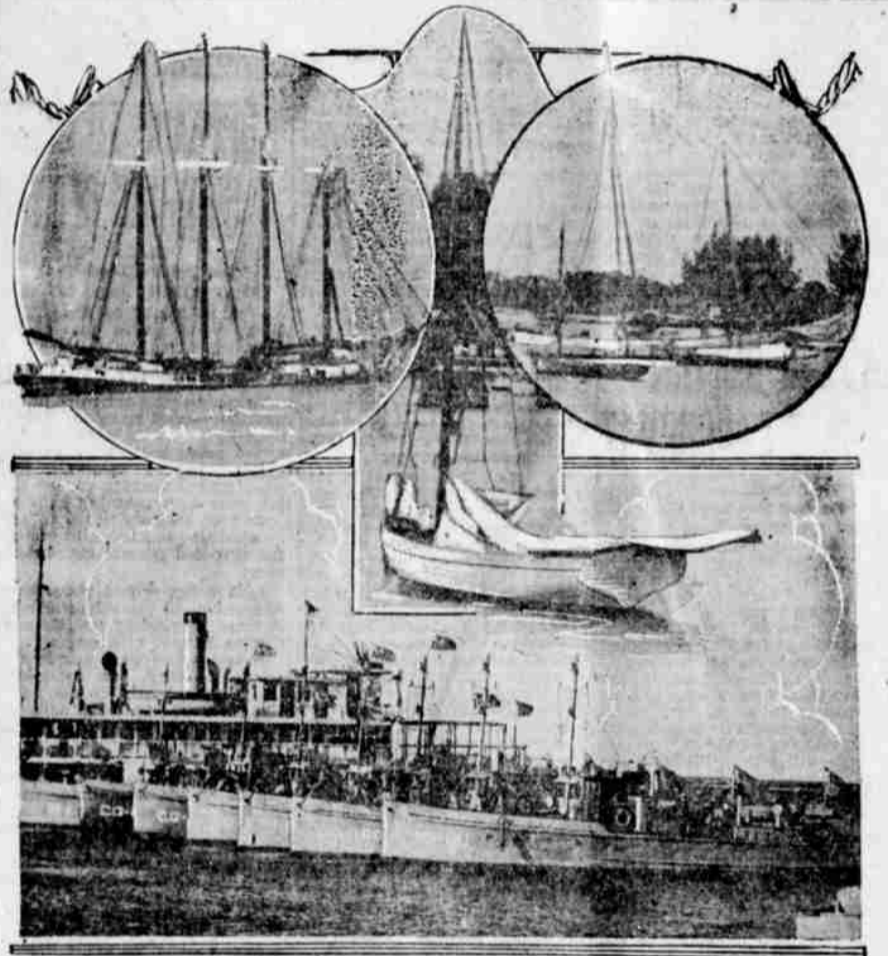

An Answer to a National Question: "What's the Prohibition Force Accomplishing?"



What is the prohibition enforcement force doing? A study of reports on file in Washington reveals that last year more than 500 ships and boats were captured while engaged in illegal transport of liquor and 5,000 automobiles. Over 10,000 illicit distilleries were discovered. The seizures of liquors and malt amounted to more than 6,500,000 gallons. At top are three types of captured run runners; below are some of the speedy run chasers that are ridding the seas of liquor smugglers.

WASHINGTON, June 19. — From all directions officials here are hearing the complaint: "This section is overrun with bootleggers and wallowing in liquor. What is the prohibition enforcement force doing?" And what is Uncle Sam's prohibition enforcement staff doing? A study of prohibition department reports gives these figures for last year: (figures for this year are not available): More than 500 ships and boats were captured while engaged in the illegal transport of liquor and more than 5,000 automobiles. Over 10,000 illicit distilleries were discovered. The seizures of distilled liquors amounted to more than 6,500,000 gallons, and of malt to more than 5,000,000 gallons. Which indicates that the dry staff, with its limited force and ambiguous duties, is rather busy. The available figures are not comprehensive. So far as any statistics are, they show just what has been done by the federal authorities charged with the enforcement of the national prohibition act, which took effect Jan. 16, 1920. But they do not show how far that enforcement work has been effective in stopping the manufacture and sale of liquor, because they are of comparative figures. They record only successful violation of the law. The successful violation studies them. Of the extent of that no one has any exact, or even approximate, knowledge.
