## TED THYE DOWNS BILLY EDWARDS

 PORTLAND, June 19.—In his first match since his return from his Australian tour, Ted Thye, Portland light-heavyweight wrestler, won 2 out of 3 falls here last night from Billy Edwards, of Kansas City.  
 Thye took the first fall in forty-two minutes with a combination wrist lock and hammer lock. Edwards pinned his opponent for the second fall in 19 minutes, 39 seconds, with a headlock and Thye ended the match by taking the third fall in 8 minutes when he lifted Edwards high in the air and crashed him to the mat pinning his shoulders before he could recover his breath.

## RIFFS WEAKENING UNDER COMBINED FRENCH, SPANISH

 FEZ, French Morocco, June 19.—An official communique today said French advanced posts north of Ouzann have been relieved after a swift advance, aerial bombardments and stiff engagements. French forces reached their objective in the Beni Mesguilla district, after inflicting severe losses upon Abd-El-Krim's Rifians.  
 PARIS, June 19.—A blockade of the Moroccan coast by French and Spanish warships to prevent arms and munitions reaching Abd-El-Krim, the warring leader of Moroccan tribesmen, became effective at five o'clock this morning. The French and Spanish governments reached an agreement last night regarding details.  
 There will be no supreme command, but the French and Spanish naval units participating in the blockade will take instructions from their respective admirals.

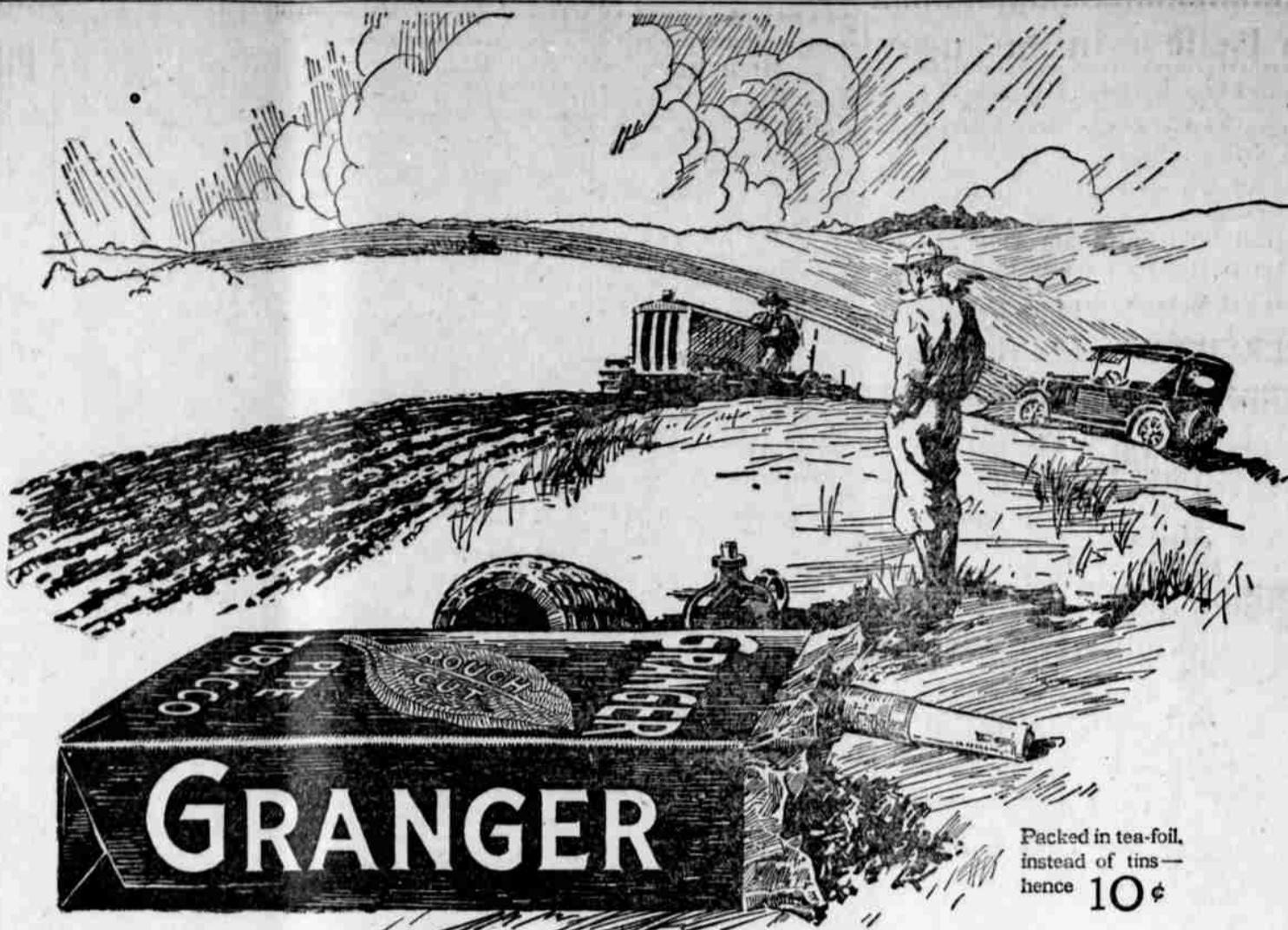
## ROWING CLASSIC BETWEEN HARVARD AND YALE TODAY

 NEW LONDON, Conn., June 19.—More than 50,000 rowing enthusiasts were assembled here today for the fifty-eighth Harvard-Yale regatta, consisting of three races on the Thames river.  
 For the first time since a Harvard eight lost with the classic in 1920, the crimson crewmen are considered a chance to win the varsity event. The betting odds favor Yale at six to five, but there is plenty of Harvard money.  
 Since 1852 Yale has walked off with the laurels 26 times to Harvard's 27. Though an eastern event of international fame, the race will be a clash of Western coaching methods. Ed Under of Yale is authoritative of Washington product.

## STATE PRESS COMMENT

### FAKE STOCK SWINDLERS

Estimates by New York banking authorities place the number of professional swindlers in the United States at 2,000,000; and the amount annually stolen by them through fake stocks alone, at not less than \$500,000,000.  
 Yet it is found that but one in 11 of these criminals is ever apprehended and brought to punishment. The principal reason for this immunity from punishment is that the victims are ashamed to confess that they have been swindled.  
 Such diffidence is not only a foolish weakness but is a stimulant to swindling. If the victims but knew it, the ordinary established professional swindler, such as the fake stock broker, lays aside from a tenth to a third of the money he takes to reimburse such victims as boldly demand restitution. It is the miser for these criminals to shut the mouths of noisy victims than to suffer the adverse advertising they would receive because of the complaints.—Portland Telegram.

### DOUBLY INELIGIBLE

The newly appointed state fish commissioner, which knows nothing about fish, is seeking as his first act, to discharge the only man in the employ who does know anything about them, Hugh Mitchell, superintendent of hatcheries, who was induced by the old commission to leave his life job under civil service as state superintendent of the United States Bureau of Hatcheries to enter the employ of the state under a long term contract.  
 Mr. Mitchell, having been for many years in charge of federal fish culture in Oregon, being recognized as the leading authority on the subject in the northwest and as knowing more about salmon than anyone else, and being efficient and competent, is thereby disqualified for office under the present administration. As he is not a politician and refuses to play politics, he is doubly disqualified.  
 The attorney general has ruled that the members of the fish commission exceed their authority in making a contract that bound their successors, but the courts will probably have to pass upon the point, just as they will upon the legality of the appointment of state senators upon the commission in defiance of the constitutional prohibitions.  
 With Mr. Mitchell out, the way is clear for carrying out the governor's plan to make political spoils out of the department, failure to carry out which cost Dr. Ross his job as commissioner.—Naim Journal.
