## FARM NEWS

### FIELD MICE CONTROL.

(By R. W. Cooney.) In western Oregon there exists several species of destructive field mice. One of these rodents is particularly destructive to stored hay. It is fortunate that this damage can be cut to almost nothing if some work is done before the hay is stored in the barn or mow.

One of the best plans is to construct several boxes about 18 inches in length made from three pieces of old boards about six or eight inches in width. Nail the boards together to form a three-sided box or triangle. Place these boxes along the edge of the mow, the hay if loose can be stacked over the boxes. The boxes should be charged with about one-half pound of prepared bait.

The bait is made as follows: 1-4 ounce strychnine (alkaloid), 3 ounce saccharine, 1-4 ounce baking soda. This mixture is thoroughly dusted upon about 10 pounds oat meal. Less quantity can be made up if desired. The cost of these materials is small indeed when compared to the loss of one or two tons of hay in the mow or storage barn.

Extension Bulletin No. 261 covers the control of a number of other rodent pests.

been trapped in the building, basing his opinion on the facts that shrieks were heard from the wreckage after the collapse of the building and also the belief that it would have been impossible for all to escape in the short interval between the explosion and the collapse of the roof.

The midnight show had just started and a love scene was playing on the screen when the blast rocked the building, bringing down the balcony as the floor gave way, according to survivors.

When the entire center section of the building collapsed, it sent bricks and debris into surrounding streets and broken windows in the buildings a block away. Thirty minutes after the explosion the south wall of the theater fell, crushing several small stores.

A negro porter in a restaurant on the ground floor of the building tried by an explosion and result said that half an hour before the was delayed while firemen pulled down standing walls that were a constant menace.

Property damage was placed at \$150,000. Fire Chief Alexander Henderson expressed the belief that not more than three persons lost their lives.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 26.—Early this afternoon no bodies had been recovered from the ruins of the G. I. s Theater building, destroyed by an explosion.
