SOUTHERN PACIFIC MAKES OFFER FOR BUILDING RAILWAY

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

WASHINGTON, June 27.—A transaction by which the Southern Pacific Company agrees to pay alternatively two different prices for one railroad was laid today before the Interstate Commerce Commission for approval.

The road is the Nevada-California-Oregon, operating 154 miles of narrow gauge in the northwest. The Southern Pacific agrees to buy from Charles Moran, the present owner, the \$750,000 of preferred stock within four years. If before the end of the year period the Southern Pacific demands delivery of the stock, it agrees to give in exchange \$725,000 in bonds, but if a demand for payment is made within that time by Moran, pay only \$400,000 in bonds. The Southern Pacific will have to transform the line to be transformed to standard gauge and new bonds issued to replace the \$750,000 N. C. O. bond issues outstanding.

JARDINE MAKES PLEA FOR GROUP MARKET SYSTEM

Market Problems Must Be Solved By Farmers and Business Men.

TIMBER IS RESOURCE

Need of Protection for Timber Areas and Future Production Stressed By Secretary.

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

PORTLAND, Ore., June 27.—William M. Jardine, secretary of agriculture, outlined what he termed the three fundamental principles of group marketing in a luncheon at the Chamber of Commerce here today. Secretary Jardine arrived in Portland shortly before noon on his tour of the coast, where he is studying farm conditions, after attending a meeting of the Agricultural Club of Oregon. Secretary Jardine was to leave tonight for Eastern Oregon to meet farmers and inspect some of the large wheat districts.

Mr. Jardine's three principles were:

A particular plan for a particular commodity; honest, efficient and experienced managers and a loyal membership which knows how the organization operates. Basic problems cannot be solved by any other method, he said.

Laws he averred, can be nothing more than shock absorbers, he said. Marketing problems must be solved by individual communities with farmers and business men working together.

"I do not need to emphasize the importance of your timber lands and your timber crops," said Secretary Jardine, turning to another subject.

"Something over one-third of the total remaining stand of saw timber in the United States lies in Oregon and Washington. This is priceless heritage. But it cannot continue to be enjoyed in proper measure unless effective thought is applied to the problem of keeping every acre of permanent forest land productive.

"This region has an opportunity to make forestry—that is, permanent timber production—part of its program before its virgin forests are gone.

"Nearly 23,000,000 acres of land in Oregon and more than 15,000,000 acres in Washington are classified as permanent forest land, useful for growing no other crop but timber.

"The Clarke-McNary act, which was largely the result of the thoughtful attention and earnest efforts by your Senator McNary, recognizes the obligation on the part of the public to help finance the protection of state and private lands, and it is our belief that the state and Federal government together should bear about half the cost of protection of such lands, relying on private ownership to meet the other half.

"It is my wish to see the contribution of the Federal Government under this program brought up to its fair proportion as rapidly as possible."

SHOWERS IN BEND PUT DOWN FIRES

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

BEND, Ore., June 27.—Six hundredths of an inch of rain fell in Bend late yesterday afternoon. The temperature during the afternoon reached 94, five degrees less than the previous day. Prospects today were for another day at least as warm as yesterday.

All forest fires were down this morning, according to the forestry office. Fire conditions were much improved with the relative humidity at 49 early this morning and it went up to more than 70 during the night.

The fire in the Southern part of the forest which was giving considerable trouble yesterday afternoon is now under control. It covers nine acres of timber. Efforts reported eleven fires in all were still burning this morning but none are serious.

FOREST FIRES ON COAST COST ONE LIFE; MILL BURNS

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., June 27.—Forest fires on the Pacific coast yesterday burned one man to death, destroyed 62,480 acres of timber, grazing and stump land and defied the efforts of more than 200 men who attempted to bring them under control.

Major blazes were traced to electrical storms while hot weather and low humidity combined to permit the flames to continue blazing away today at many points in California, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia.

At Point Neville, British Columbia, Oliver G. Clark was burned to death when a fire swept through his camp.

Two other fires in British Columbia burned two bridges, two small homes and destroyed a lumber mill of the Blue Bird Lumber Company.

The Blue Bird fire destroyed 100,000,000 feet of lumber.

In California the largest fire of recent years is raging on a 100 mile front in Tuolumne county, 51,200 acres of brush having been burned over.

This fire was also started by an electrical storm. Volunteer fire fighters are fighting the blaze and the fire warden has appealed for more men.

After burning over 25,000 acres of grazing land the fire which started in the Stanislaus river canyon, California, was reported under control late last night.

A fire which started on a ranch near Orange Vale, Cal., spread into nearby fields and burned over several acres of land before being extinguished.

The buildings on the ranch were all destroyed.

Three thousand five hundred acres of brush and timber were burned over by a fire in the Angeles mountain forest near San Bernardino.

A fire north of Bremerton, Wash., destroyed 1,200 acres of timber.

One hundred people are homeless as a result of a fire which destroyed practically all of the homes in a lumber camp near Monahan, Wash.
