HEALTH UNIT MAKES REPORT FOR QUARTER. Great Deal of Work Accomplished During Past Three Months. UNIT HIGH IN STATE. Ranks Among First in State, Particularly From Standpoint of Number of Defects Corrected.

The Douglas County Health unit has just completed its quarterly report for the three months ending June 30, and it is indicated that the members of the unit have been very busy.

The Douglas County unit ranks well with the other organizations of the state as shown by the comparative report issued by the state board of health for the month of May. This shows the local unit to be doing work equal in all respects to the other units, while in many instances particularly in the correction of defects, the Douglas county organization leads.

DEFENSE DAY IS EXPLAINED. The members of Rotary were privileged to day to listen to a very interesting and instructive discourse on National Defense Day by Capt. W. L. H. Osborne.

General Pershing was responsible for the 1920 act setting aside National Defense Day, which is quite comprehensive in its manner of dealing with the nation's man power in case of war being declared by this country.

At the close of his talk Captain Osborne stated the members of the club to stand and take the oath of National Defense Day, which they did to a man, and put their "John Henry" on the dotted line as evidence of their faith in the nation's war program.
