## PEOPLE WHO SAW SANTA BARBARA QUAKE IN CITY

Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Dillon, of Los Angeles, were in Roseburg today on their way to Portland. They were in Santa Barbara on the day of the earthquake and tell of that most thrilling experience in a very graphic way.

The damage to the city, he says, is much more severe than has been stated. The city is 60 per cent demolished, he estimates, stating that there is hardly a building left intact.

The streets were piled full of wreckage, he states, and the city, when we returned was in great confusion. In some places we found that concrete pavement, unbroken, had been moved over ten or twelve inches, lined up absolutely true.

Mr. Dillon states that he believes the loss of life to be more severe than stated, while the damage is very high. He and his wife are on their way to Portland for a visit.
