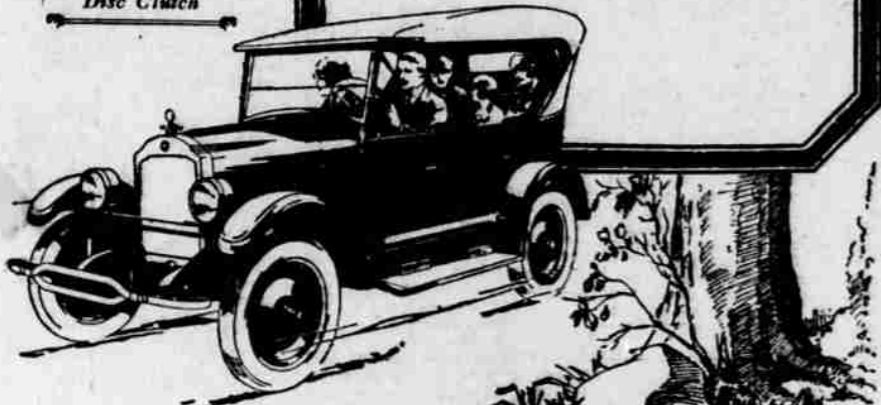

FARM REMINDERS

The greatest benefits of Oregon crop rotation as listed by the experiment station are the humus and nitrogen added to the soil. Other advantages are diversity of crops with steady output, more even distribution of work through the year, eradication of weeds, plant diseases, insects, and toxins, and improvement of tilth and water-holding capacity of the soils.

Current and gooseberry anthracnose or leaf spot may be checked in Oregon bushes by a bordeaux spray, 4-4-50, just after the fruit is picked. Lime-sulfur may be used for this application, but the

experiment station has found it rather less effective and more apt to cause spray injury in hot weather than the bordeaux.

Move the brooder house on to clean ground, says the O. A. C. experiment station. Coccidiosis, round worms and roup may be waiting the chicks on last year's run. It does not pay to treat chickens for these diseases, but it does pay to prevent them getting the diseases.

Additional means of combating the unsatisfactory wormy apple in Oregon is destroying wormy apples at thinning time. This practice, recommended by the experiment station, is supplemental to spray control.

Be sure to feed good buttermilk or sour skim milk to chicks, says the O. A. C. station. Many chicks are ruined each year by feeding milk in which there is washing soda or some other form of neutralizer.

One of the quickest ways to kill chicks is by feeding them moldy grain, say reports sent the O. A. C. station. Do not try to save a few cents by feeding some of the grain that was left over from last year and allowed to become moldy.

Examine it carefully and if there is any doubt, don't use it.

European canker, destructive on certain varieties of pears and occasionally apples, is materially reduced by cutting out cankers and spraying with bordeaux before fall rains set in, the experiment station reports.

Leaf spot of cherry and prune is reported most generally where trees are crowded, or on thin soil. Where known to be troublesome it is straped for according to directions in the O. A. C. spray calendar.

Don't wait until the chicks are ready to take out of the incubator before looking at the brooder above, says the state college experiment station. See that all equipment is in working order and have a supply of clean, dry sand ready to put on the floor under the hover.

The second cover spray for codling-moth in eastern Oregon is applied two weeks after the first. A third cover spray, says the experiment station, is applied four weeks later, and a fourth four weeks after the third.

Get Rid of the Poor Cow. Board's Dairyman says that no matter how strongly organized, the dairymen of a locality may be, or what the quality of the produce may be, they cannot make a profit with low producing cows. It is just as logical to keep low producing cows as it is for the creamery owners to hold that milk and cream grading is impractical.

Following Big Business Lead. Illinois farmers have organized and are carrying their own auto insurance at 13 cents per \$100. Already the organization has over 10,000 policy holders. The membership is limited to farmers organizations and their immediate families. The low rate makes it a very popular organization. And up in Saskatchewan the co-operative hall insurance association has 30,000 farmer members; carries \$25,000,000 policies per year at a low rate, and last year its premiums were \$250,000, its losses \$132,000 and surplus \$178,000. It has a reserve of \$1,600,000 and the management states as this surplus increases, it will be possible to materially reduce the present rates.

The money he used to spend on clothes goes into tires and gas and health and happiness."

"In a nutshell, the passenger car or motor truck is a necessity not a luxury, and it takes a long while to reach the saturation point with a necessity. There may be a saturation point somewhere, but it will never be reached until every place where the automobile can be used profitably is full."

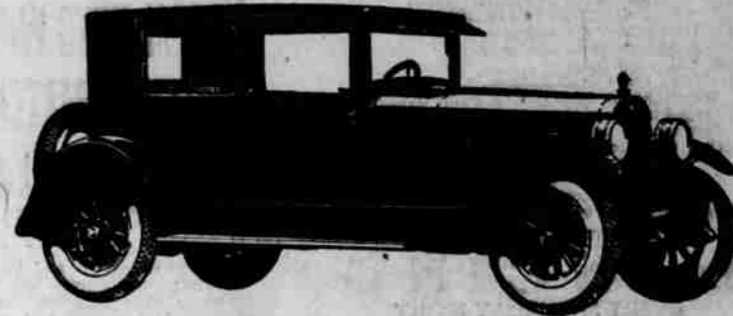

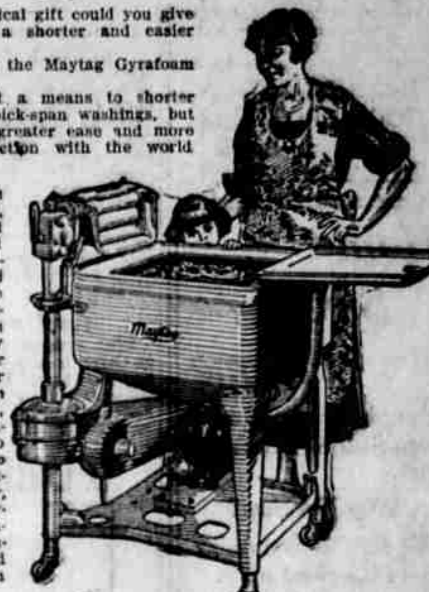
