## GEORGE BONEBRAKE TO HEAD ROAD WORK IN UMPQUA FOREST

George A. Bonebrake, assistant supervisor on the Umpqua National Forest, left today for Big Camas road camp, where he will take personal charge of the road work being done in that district. He will be in charge of all construction work between Big Camas and Diamond Lake, a distance of 25 miles, and also on the Crater Park-Crescent Lake road to the Deschutes forest line. The Big Camas-Diamond Lake road has all been cleared, and is now being graded. The work north is of harder construction, but is a most important road, linking up a portion of the Skyline road. Mr. Bonebrake is an experienced road builder, and because of his many years of experience on the Umpqua National forest will be able to conduct the work very efficiently.

In the closing minutes of the trial the defense filed a demurrer to the indictment against Edy, based upon highly technical legal and grammatical points. The court overruled the demurrer.

## COMMON USER OF S. P. LINES IS HIT BY RESOLUTION

At a joint meeting of the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce directors held yesterday, a resolution was adopted opposing the joint user proposition on the Southern Pacific lines in eastern Oregon. The resolution adopted is as follows: Whereas: It has come to our attention that certain railway lines from the north, terminating at Bond, Oregon, have applied to the Interstate Commerce Commission for permission to enter Klamath Falls, Oregon, from their present terminus at Bond, Oregon, by constructing a line to Skookum, Oregon, thence to have common user rights of the Southern Pacific line from Skookum, Oregon, to Klamath Falls, Oregon, thus entering territory which is now being amply served by present existing lines, and, Whereas: Such common user privilege if granted will not afford additional transportation facilities through the region they are asking to enter, would not open up new territory or create additional markets but contrary-wise, would tend to divide business and markets by duplication, and, Whereas: The Southern Pacific lines have expended and are offering to expend unlimited capital in the development of our state, and by the extension of the Oregon, California and Eastern Railway and by changing the Nevada, California and Eastern Railway lines to standard gauge and otherwise improving for the purpose of affording ample transportation facilities along the territory served by these lines, and is now engaged in constructing the Natron cut-off lines between Eugene and Klamath Falls, Oregon, which with their main line between Dunsmuir, California and Eugene, Oregon, provides ample north and south service to this territory, and there appears no justification for granting common user privileges of these existing or proposed lines, and, Whereas: The Umpqua valley produces large quantities of perishable fruits, and vegetables and dried fruits, and otherwise heavy tonnage from the field and forest, and that the Southern Pacific lines have served this valley and Douglas county, efficiently and well both with respect to operation and supply of equipment and otherwise in a most satisfactory manner without competition, and, Whereas: The spirit of the transportation act of 1920, known as the Esch Cummins law governing common carriers, is to prohibit duplication and wasteful investments of new lines, for the reason that in the end the public pays the interest on such investments, therefore, be it: Resolved, That the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce hereby extends a vote of confidence to the Southern Pacific lines, hereby affirming that their service to this territory as above referred to has been satisfactory and that we are opposed to any joint or common user privilege of existing or contemplated lines as we do not want the transportation system on which we rely weakened, and be it further: Resolved: That should the Interstate Commerce Commission find there is further transportation facilities required in new territory that in our opinion additional lines should be constructed and traffic interchanged at Skookum, Oregon, be it further: Resolved: That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to the Interstate Commerce Commission and the Public Service Commission of Oregon. 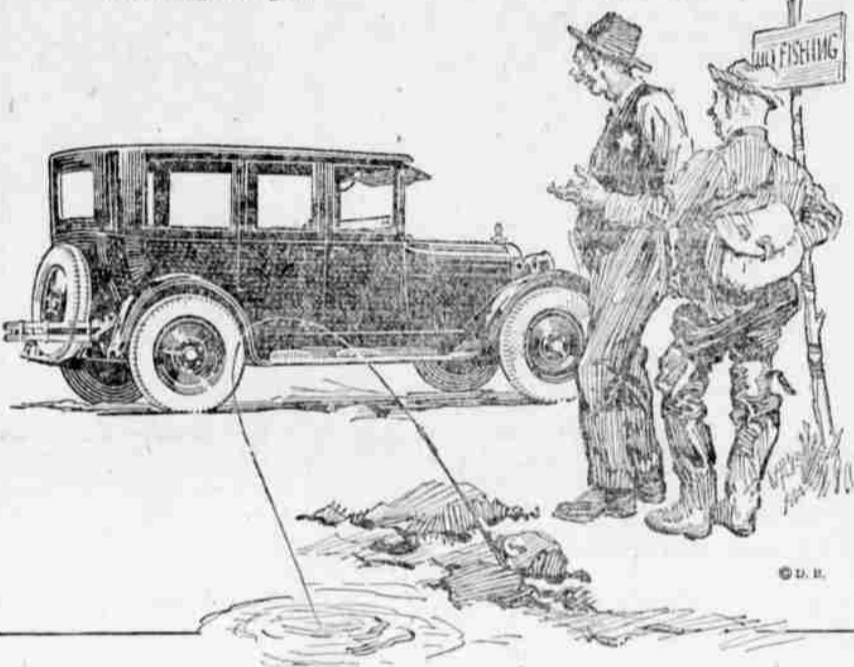
