## PURSUIT PLANES CONTINUE FLIGHT OVER MAIL ROUTE

(Associated Press Leased Wire.) SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, July 23.—The six United States army planes flying over the air mail route from Mount Clemens, Michigan, to San Francisco, hopped off from here at 8:30 o'clock this morning. The next scheduled stop is Elko, Nevada.

Perfect flying weather prevailed when the planes got away. They reached here late yesterday from Cheyenne, Wyoming, after a delay at Rock Springs, Wyoming, because of a rain storm.

### RENO, Nev., July 23.—Six army pursuit planes flying over the air mail route from Mount Clemens, Michigan, to San Francisco, hopped off from Elko at 11:50 a. m. today, according to word received at the air mail field here by radio.

It is understood that they will not stop in Reno, but will attempt to make the flight from Elko to San Francisco without further stops.

### HOPE SPIDERS COLLECT ON THE UNDER SURFACE OF HOP LEAVES AS THE SEASON ADVANCES.

The first injury appears as small pale specks on the leaf surface. They spin fine webs on the surface of the leaves and lay little spherical eggs in them. These have a sticky base with which they pierce the tissues. Sulfur is the standard remedy recommended by the O. A. C. experiment station.

### CLEANING UP CROP REMAINS, LITTER, RUBBISH, AND WEED PLOTS ARE VERY MATERIALLY IN CLEANING OUT THE ARSIVIC PEST, THE O. A. C. EXPERIMENT STATION HAS FOUND.

extension service specialists to the farms of those who attempt it. The growers usually receive a premium for their seed, and small fee is asked to help pay the expenses.

Succession vegetable crops for fall and winter use, such as cabbage, cauliflower, brussels sprouts, kale, broccoli, and celery, can be set out on ground cleared of the early maturing crops. By making suitable plans and carrying them out promptly the Oregon garden or farm or country lot may be made to perform double duty.

Provision may also be made for successive seedings of radish and lettuce, designated by the experiment station as important all year vegetables.

See hives well placed under Oregon conditions do not rest directly on the ground. Timbers 2 by 6 inches, bricks, or special stands are used for supports, a stand 6 inches high being the best.

A sloping board is placed from the ground to the entrance to permit heavily laden bees that drop near the hive to reach the entrance.

It is economy on the part of Oregon farmers who raise stock to pasture the stubble field with hogs or sheep, the experiment stations indicate. The grain shattered or lodged will be readily gathered up by them and converted into a marketable form.

Where considerable grain has lodged, hogs are used. Sheep are a good substitute.

Full foundation sheets provide straight combs for manipulation, save wax in producing comb honey, and cause the bees to build worker cells. If left to themselves, Oregon bees are prone to build many drone cells. Frames fitted for full sheets of foundation may be bought from bee supply men, and directions for manipulation will be supplied on request by the O. A. C. department of entomology.
