WALLA WALLA, Wash., Aug. 14.—Two of the four trains now operating between Walla Walla and Pendleton on the Union Pacific railway will, on August 29, be replaced by a large automobile bus, according to announcement made here today by W. J. Leonard, district freight and passenger agent.

And as for knives and ropes, it is recalled that Harry Tracy and David Merrill had rifles hidden in the prison.

Farm House Visited. SALEM, Ore., Aug. 14.—Those in charge of the man hunt for Tom Murray, Ellsworth Kelly and James Wilcox, escaped convicts, this morning said that they were assured that the fugitives are still in the Pratum neighborhood by the report telephoned to the prison that the McElheny farm house, 7 miles south of Silverton, was pillaged during the night.
