**10,000 GERMANS AID FRENCH IN WARFARE AGAINST RIFLIANS**

(Associated Press Leased Wire.)

PARIS, Aug. 26.—Once enemies at arms, 16,000 Germans—exactly half the total strength of the French foreign legion—are in Morocco fighting the battle of France against the rebellious Moorish tribesmen.

Applications from former German soldiers to be permitted to lend their aid to their former enemies in the warfare against the Riflians, are coming in such numbers that it is impossible for the French ministry of war to accept all of them.

The foreign legion, to which the Germans are attached has been in the thick of the fight since Abd-el-Krim, the Moroccan war lord, began his offensive and French officers assert that the Germans have given a good account of themselves.

**OWNER OF OREGON TIMBER IS DEAD**

KALAMAZOO, Mich., Aug. 26.—Woodbury Ransom, 52, director in a score of Kalamazoo's leading industrial and banking concerns, an extensive holder in timber projects in Oregon and Arkansas, and reputed to be Kalamazoo's wealthiest man, died yesterday. He had been ill two years.

**TAXES FORCE MOVIES FROM CONNECTICUT.**

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Members of the Motion Picture Producers and Distributors of America will remove all exchanges from Connecticut at the conclusion of existing contracts, President Will Hays announced today.

Mr. Hays denied reports that shipments of films into the state had been stopped because of the taxes imposed by Connecticut, but added that no further contract would be made until the situation had been remedied.
