COUNTY FINED \$750 BECAUSE VIOLATION

(Continued from page 1.) used to help in pushing the ferry across the stream. On August 11 a government inspector crossed the river on the ferry and discovered the absolute limit in law violation. The county court with utter disregard for the laws of this greater of all nations had furnished neither bell, whistle, horn or other signaling device, for said ferry. No life preservers were carried, no fire extinguishers, the operator had no license, and there were no license numbers on either the bow or the stern, and besides the ferry was operated without pilot rules. Consequently he immediately reported these flagrant violations and the county was fined \$250 for having no pilot rules, \$100 for having no whistle or horn, \$100 for having no bell, \$100 for having no life preservers, \$100 for having no licensed operator, \$100 for having no fire extinguisher, and \$10 for having no letters on the bow.

It is certain that the people of Douglas county had no intimation of the enormity of the crime of the county court. Just think of the absolute depravity in allowing a ferry boat to cross the broad expanse of the mighty Umpqua without whistle, horn or bell. The fact that both ends are securely tied to a cable is not in the least a mitigating circumstance. If any other boat should want to pass even though it might be anchored to the same cable, how could the ferryman exchange courtesies with a horn?

But worst of all—almost beyond belief—the county court has permitted the ferry to ply from one bank to the other of the Umpqua river, almost 100 yards, without pilot rules. What if the ferry should become lost enroute and the lives of innocent people be endangered, just because the ferryman failed to take on a pilot when nearing shore?

In order to prevent further difficulty, we suggest a set of rules for the operation of ferries:

- 1. All ferries shall be operated by a ferryman, to be known as the skipper, and an assistant to be designated as first mate. 2. All ferries shall be equipped with a whistle, horn and bell, all of which shall be sounded in turn before the ferry leaves the shore. 3. In starting the perilous voyage the skipper shall instruct the mate to up anchor and cast off, and while the mate mans the capstan, the skipper shall sing a chantey. The mate shall then proceed to the bow of the ship, and shall speak those immortal words of all true sailors: "Soldier, you can't stand there." The mate shall then lengthen the cables on the rear of the ferry and shorten those on the front, in order to take advantage of the current of the stream. He shall then proceed to attach the ignition wires and crank

MEDFORD WOMAN INJURED YESTERDAY

Mrs. Francis Campbell, a Medford woman, lies in Mercy Hospital seriously injured as a result of an auto accident yesterday afternoon at about 5 o'clock, when the car in which she was riding went over the grade at Hairpin Curve, at the top of Camas mountain.

Mrs. Campbell, with her husband was in the car, driving toward the coast. Mr. Campbell stopped the car on the grade, applying the brakes, and getting out of the car to look around. When stepping in front of the car, he noticed a block of wood in front of the right front wheel, and kicked it from under the wheel. The block which was holding the car from movement, when removed let the car slide, it going over the grade, turning slightly to the right, and making a complete turn over and landing in a large pile of lumber poles. Mrs. Campbell was pinned under the wheel, and it was with some difficulty that she was removed. Dr. Chas. B. Wade was called to the scene of the accident, and the woman brought to this city, where she was taken to Mercy hospital.

She suffered a deep scalp wound to the right of her head, the wound continuing down her forehead, and into the right eye, tearing the lid, which may possibly cause serious injury to the sight. Another wound three inches long, on the forehead, also went the length of her left lid, but did not penetrate the eyeball. She suffered bruises about the right shoulder and other parts of her body, and may also have a fracture of her right shoulder. Her condition is such that she is unable to be moved, and until she is improved, no X-ray will be taken. It is thought that she is suffering from a fracture of the skull but this cannot be determined until an X-ray is taken, and further examination is made.

The car was badly wrecked, and until a late hour today men working in an effort to remove it from the ditch, had been unsuccessful. One wheel was completely smashed, the top completely torn to pieces, and other damages sustained.
