LITTLE HOPE REMAINS FOR LOST FLIERS

(Continued from page 1) the wind due to the lack of gasoline and was forced to land with the wind on the tail which forced him down, a highly precarious operation in any sort of a sea with about one chance in a hundred of landing safely.

Second, that he was blinded by the heavy rain squalls to which he referred in his last series of messages and that the aviators, with their clouded goggles, were unable to distinguish rain from the sea, thought they had more "ceiling" than they really possessed, descended slightly and struck the ocean at high flying speed, which would have resulted in a crash and the wrecking of the plane.

Meanwhile haggard officers, some of whom have had practically no sleep since Sunday, pore over charts, plotting each report from the searching ships and hoping that "the miracle" will come about and "Commander John," his companions and the PN-9-1 will be saved to the navy.

Flares Give Hope. SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 2.—The navy department has instructed Admiral Robison to dispatch 18 destroyers that left Samoa, September 1, for Hawaii to the search zone to participate in the hunt for the missing PN-9-1, and its crew.

In announcing that the ships which were returning from the Australian cruise would be used to endeavor to find Commander Rodgers' plane, the flight command here stated that "there is a ray of hope" in the telegram which the Whippoorwill sent that

it had seen a white flare and two flares or rockets at 7:10 and 8:10 last night. These were seen in the Kaula channel on the far side of the island of Oahu.

Signals Fruitless. HONOLULU, Sept. 4.—Just before midnight the tender U. S. S. Whippoorwill, searching in mid-Pacific waters for the missing PN-9-1, naval seaplane, reported: "At 7:10 p. m. we saw white spot for one hour and then saw two flares or rockets from starboard. Have been steaming now for half hour, but seen nothing more."

Gunn was given a great battle by Dick Jones, of White Plains, N. Y., but the youth ended the match on the 33rd hole, being five up and three to go.

Jones and Gunn will meet in a 35-hole match tomorrow for the crown.

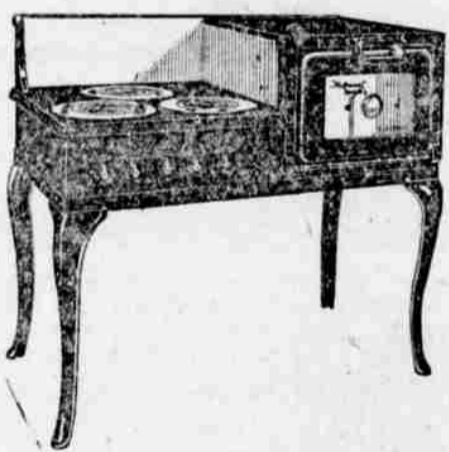

COMMANDER OF PLANE FORESAW TRIP'S DANGER

Two children survive, one by Commander Lansdowne's previous marriage.

Mrs. Joy Bright Hancock was brave under the second tragedy of this sort in her life. Her first husband was killed when the ZIEZ was destroyed. She had only recently married Lieutenant Commander Louis Hancock, Jr., who was killed in the Shenandoah.

One little girl, the daughter of James W. Cullinan of Binghamton, N. Y., was waiting to celebrate her sixth birthday today. She has not been told of her father's death.

Several of the unmarried men who perished were engaged. Secretary Wilbur telegraphed messages of sympathy to the families of the victims.

Lansdowne Not Satisfied. LAKEHURST, N. J., Sept. 4.—Mrs. Zachary Lansdowne, widow of the commanding officer of the wrecked Shenandoah, today asserted that she had not criticized the secretary of the navy in her comments of last night on the advisability of the flight of the Shenandoah to the middle west.

"I was misunderstood last night," said Mrs. Lansdowne. "Commander Lansdowne was very much opposed to making the flight at this time and he advised the department accordingly. Having been born in the Ohio valley he knew weather conditions out there and had some fear of them."

From another source it was learned today that Commander Lansdowne, before starting on the ill-fated trip, had criticized the water recovery system installed about six weeks ago and had declared that he intended having it removed.

Among men who understood the ship's construction, it was freely declared that the ship could have weathered the storm with the old system.

The original water recovery system distributed the water recovered from exhaust gas of the engines to ballast tanks scattered throughout the ship to counteract the loss in weight from gasoline consumption. The new system, installed at section 110, near the place where the dirigible is said to have broken, concentrated a great part of the recovered water in canvas bags holding 3 tons at the spot where the ship broke.

Not only is it believed that the new system concentrated too much weight in one part of the ship, but in addition, it is believed that the cutting of one of the main circular ribs of the ship and an intermediate rib for installation of the new system resulted in further weakness. These formed the main structure of the ship.

The two ribs, or rings as they are called in dirigible construction, were reinforced by a square connection instead of the original circular form and this was also criticized by Commander Lansdowne

in private conversations just before departure of the ship.
