PORTLAND CROWD BY RISING VOTE ENDORSES DAWES

(Associated Press Local Wire.)

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 8.—Charles G. Dawes, vice president, was enroute to San Francisco today after speaking here last night to a crowd that filled the Municipal auditorium. He attacked the senate rules in permitting long drawn out speeches and filibusters and the crowd voiced such approval in applause that the vice president asked for a rising vote of endorsement of his fight, which was promptly given.

Mr. Dawes promised to speak today at Grants Pass and he may also speak at Ashland while the train stops there.

His speech last night was a vigorous attack upon the senate rules, and he quoted from other senators who had criticized the methods of senate procedure.

unless it is improved by reclamation," said Stanfield.

"Yes," was the reply.

E. T. Allen, forester in charge of Western Forestry and Conservation Association, was the first person called.

Fire Patrol Money Needed.
He asked that the government appropriate funds to aid in maintaining fire patrols and in fighting fires in the timbered public domain in the western states. He said that now private owners and the states are paying the government's share for this work.

"These sections of the public domain form a great fire hazard to all surrounding property," said Allen, "and they must be cared for as best we can. The danger of the spread of fire is as great from poor lands as from the better timbered tracts."

Allen thought the government's share for the work of safeguarding the public domain outside the national forests and other tracts, cared for now, would be from \$50,000 to \$75,000 annually. The committee will be in Pendleton Thursday and Friday, and in Baker Saturday.
