For the dairymen of Douglas county there will be much of value in the county agricultural economic conference if the plans of the committee on dairying headed by L. A. Blackwell, of Hoodport, are carried out. According to the last census Douglas county has nearly 10,000 dairy cattle of all ages of which 6,452 are producing cows. PIERCE MAKES NO PROMISE TO AID VALE COLONIZING

(Associated Press Special Wire.)
SALEM, Ore., Sept. 17.—Governor Pierce makes no definite promise to Edward Meade, commissioner of the federal reclamation service that the state will aid in colonizing the Vale project, in a letter to Meade made public today. He says, however, that he will ask the 1927 legislature for a law completely re-organizing the reclamation system in this state. As far as state aid in settling the Vale project is concerned, the governor says only that at least two sessions of the legislature will pass before the government can complete the project, and that because of over-congestion in the cities, people will logically go back to the land, which, should, he believes, insure settlement of the project.

The governor's letter is in reply to one of August 7, from Meade in which the commissioner indicated that a guarantee of state aid in settlement would be required before the government goes ahead.

The governor's letter says in part: "Oregon is very anxious to have the government commence work on this project at once. The water is already in storage and the parched acres await its magic touch to bring forth abundant crops to feed a hungry world. The government has the money and the credit and the expenditure required on this project is small indeed when compared with the many millions being spent on other gigantic projects of far less value to our republic."

It appears to me that it is your duty, as head of your department, and my duty, as governor of the state, to devise methods by which these ends may be accomplished and a healthful, prosperous, American community established where now there are a few struggling settlers on a project which is near to being abandoned.

"I would call your attention to the fact that Oregon, under the present law passed by congress has until such time as you are ready to turn on the water at the Vale project to work out its plans for settlement and financing. Having full faith and credit in the state of Oregon, as I know you have, you are surely authorized under the law to commence construction at once upon the necessary ditch to convey this water from the Warm Springs reservoir to the lands awaiting irrigation."

"It will require three years or more for the government to finish this construction, during which time the Oregon legislators will meet twice in regular session, ample time for the enactment of such legislation as may be necessary to meet the requirements of your department. I shall recommend to the next regular session of the Oregon legislature the passage of a bill for the re-construction of the entire irrigation plan in Oregon. At some stages of land development the settlers must have a certain amount of credit, but an over-abundance of credit is often a serious detriment to success for a business man or a farmer."

"With the conception in our minds of the rapidly approaching breaking point, the movement back to the land has already commenced. With improvement in economic conditions affecting the producer, there will be absolutely no difficulty in securing the settlers; in fact, they will be waiting in line long before the water is ready on the Baker, the Owyhee and the Vale projects."

"Unquestionably, long before you are ready to deliver water on the Vale project, Oregon, with her ample resources and ever increasing population, will be ready to meet any reasonable demand which your department may see fit to impose for settlement and financing. Therefore, may I ask, as governor of this state, that construction work be commenced immediately."
