Next Monday will be devoted to physical examinations. Tuesday and Wednesday the new students will take the freshmen English examination and the placement or intelligence test. Entrance to the University is not conditioned upon the showing made in the intelligence test, which will be given for the first time this year. Rather, it is for the purpose of supplying the scholarship committee and the faculty with information upon which it will be possible for departments voluntarily to section classes later upon intelligence and performance.
