### OPERATIONS OF BRIGANDS HALT AMERICAN PLANS

HARBIN, Sept. 22.—The recent tragic death of Morgan Palmer at the hands of Chinese brigands on his ranch in northern Manchuria forms the latest chapter in a history of ten years' effort by Americans to develop modern agriculture in China on a large scale.

### PORTLAND MAN TO GET CONTRACT FOR PIPE LINE

SUTHERLIN, Ore., Sept. 22.—A. D. Kern, Portland contractor, was the low bidder here Saturday and doubtless will receive the contract for the construction of the proposed water intake and supply line, bids for which were opened by the town council.

It is expected that the contract will be awarded early this week, as the city is anxious to get to work on the project.

Mr. Kern's bid was \$48,742. Washburn & Hall, Portland and Myrtle Creek contractors, also submitted proposals on the work. They were second low with a bid of \$49,403.

J. D. Hanley, also of this city, with offices in the Gasco building, was third low man with a figure of \$49,538.

The contract calls for wrapped steel pipe, 12-gauge.

The plans and specifications and report were made by Edgar & Cunningham, Portland engineers.

SCOTTS Bluffs, Neb., Sept. 22.—Scotts Bluffs fans interested in this season's prospects at Notre Dame can have it from the coach that the school of "Four Horsemen" fame will probably lose at least two games, and in losing only two will consider it a successful season.

With the house that was built upon "Rock" crumbled, that distinguished figure in the football world—Knut Rockne—is intent upon building a "bigger and better" team, a habit the man seems to have. But the new team probably will not be completed this year, and it is this that the fans are studying.

For willingness, the little army that Coach Rockne commands at Notre Dame is unbeatable. Many of the candidates for the 1925 team have had the benefit of Rockne's lecture and practice.

Others have been on the Freshman squad, the reserve team that Rockne seasons with small conflicts, or the inter-hall teams that are given varsity supervision.

From this large camp of recruits, Rockne hopes to select a picked eleven.

"Notre Dame will probably lose at least two games," Rockne says. "If only two are chalked up against us, we can consider the season successful."

Glenn Crowe, captain, is about the only lineman whose name appeared in last year's game reports. The fleet end had little opportunity to open up with Collins and Hunsinger in the field, but his chance this year will be unlimited.
