There is some misunderstanding egarding the payment of the sec-nd half, taxes, according to harles Roberts, chief deputy in he tax collecting department he sheriff's office. Taxes,

the sheriff's office. Taxes, he states, are due on October 5, the same as usual and interest will be assessed after that date.

The last legislature, he says, passed a law which sets the dates for the payment of first and second half taxes on May 5 and November 5, each year, instead of April 5 and October 5 as at present. The new law, however, does not become effective until after the first of the year, so the second half taxes for this year must be paid before October 5, as interest will be added after that date. Penalty and interest is attached after November 5 of this year."
